ENGLISH	
Our texts this term is:	The Colour Monster by Anna Llenas Lost and Found by Oliver Jeffers Leaf Man by Lois Ehlert
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> -Introduce new vocabulary and provide opportunities to use new words. -Developing reading skills such as comprehension -Describing characters, events and settings in stories familiar to us. -Shared writing opportunities (children sharing their thoughts whilst an adult scribes). 	

RE
In RE this term we will be learning about:
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Our school values, focusing on what each values means and how we demonstrate them. - The Battle of Jericho and our school vision.

MATHS
In maths this term we will be learning to:
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> -Match objects and find pairs. -Sort objects based on their attributes such as size, colour or shape. -Compare amounts using language 'fewer/fewest', 'more/most' and 'equal/same'. -Compare size, mass and capacity. -Make simple patterns.

PSHRE
In PSRHE this term we will be learning about:
Being Me in My World: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Help others to feel welcome/know that everyone has similarities and differences. - Recognise and manage feelings. - Working with others to make our class a good place to be. - Why it is good to be kind to others. - Learn what 'responsibility' means.

TOPIC
Our projects this term are: Me and My Community and Exploring Autumn
In the Me and My Community project, your child will learn about the school community and building friendships. They will explore the school grounds and find out about all the people in school who are there to help them. They will explore how they are special and unique and how everyone's family is different. They will take part in practical activities to support them to build new friendships and explore what makes a good friend. They will also find out about people in the community who help us, including doctors, nurses, and the emergency services.
In the Exploring Autumn project, your child will go on a woodland walk to learn about the seasonal changes that happen in autumn. They will learn about birds and animals that live in the woods and how they survive

as the weather gets colder. They will take part in practical and creative activities that will support them to learn about autumn.

Literacy	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Sharing stories - Shared writing linked to focus texts (good friend checklist, Leaf Man stories)
Communication and Language Development	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Opportunities to talk about families, experiences. - Discussions about stories we have read. - Discussions about school – trying new things, making new friends, being part of the community.
Physical Development	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Dough disco sessions – strength muscles ready for writing. - Join in whole class activities such as dancing and exercising.
Personal, Social and Emotional Development	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Talk about our families and people who are important to us. - Understand our school rules and how to follow them.
Understanding the World	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Discussions about our own families and how they might be different to others. - Discussions about emergency services and people who help us (police officers, fire fighters, paramedics etc.). - Exploring different environment and identifying autumn changes. - Investigating animals that live in woodlands.
Expressive Arts and Design	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Create a friendship rainbow with our new friends. - Create artwork using natural materials such as leaves and sticks. - Join in songs and rhymes.

How you can help at home for these projects

Me and My Community

- Look at family photographs together and discuss who is part of your family and extended family.
- Look at baby photographs and talk about how they have grown.
- Look at any childhood photographs of parents and grandparents.
- Talk about the things you like to do together and places you like to go.

Exploring Autumn

- Go on a walk around your local area and talk about what happens to trees and plants during autumn. Take some pictures to share at school.
- Collect leaves, seeds, nuts and berries to add to an autumn collection.
- Make some bird food to feed the birds as the weather gets colder.
