# **Building work update**

You may have read in the media over the summer about the state of schools across the country and how under-funded they are to physically maintain their buildings. Once again, we buck the national trend and are fortunate to have quality investment being made in the Academy. Over the summer, surveyors, architects and builders have been busy on our site. Two new spaces have been converted to meet our needs for this new academic year and beyond: last year's Poplar class (year 3) has been converted to become our fourth Early Years class, complete with toilets and outside space; and the computing room and music studio have been converted into a new classroom for year 6 class, Ash (pictured). Scaffolding is currently in place around our KS2 building, ready for roof replacement work, which will commence next month.





Year 4 pupil Nathaniel Downie set himself a challenge to crawl 2km around the Common to raise vital funds for the Teenage Cancer Trust over the summer holiday.
