CHALLENGING OUR STUDENTS

In addition to offering advanced courses and electives, SAS students may enroll in credit-earning courses at the University of the South. SAS transports students to the University to attend classes with college professors and college students. The University of the South issues transcripts for these courses. This fall, students are enrolled in Cicero; Literature & Composition; Introduction to Macroeconomics; Intermediate Chinese; Intermediate Spanish; Introduction to Hispanic Literature; Macroeconomic Theory; and Calculus II. Because of the option for this authentic college opportunity, **we do not offer Advanced Placement courses.**

INDEPENDENT STUDY, with the approval of the Curriculum Committee and under the guidance of a faculty sponsor, is an option for qualified juniors and seniors who submit proposals that clearly demonstrate objectives and academic substance.

THE SENIOR CREDAL STATEMENT, the presentation of a unique and personal statement of beliefs, is a requirement for graduation and a valued tradition.

CHARACTERISTICS

- Founded in 1981 as a merger of Sewanee Academy (est. 1868) and St. Andrew's School (est. 1905)
- Grades 6-12, boarding may begin in 7th grade
- 2021 Enrollment: 236 from 17 states and 13 countries
- 19% are students of color, 10% are international
- 63% receive financial support
- Student-Teacher ratio 8-1, average class size 14
- 90% of graduates attend college upon graduation. 10% join the military, pursue gap year activities, or enter directly into the workforce.
- Located on a 550-acre campus in rural Tennessee

CURRICULUM

Academic requirements at SAS are designed to ensure a broad distribution of courses and areas of study while allowing the individual student to pursue special interests. Each student is required to successfully complete a core curriculum before pursuing electives.

ACADEMIC CALENDAR

Two semesters divided into nine-week quarter. Afternoon Programs are on a trimester calendar.

CLASS FORMAT, BLOCK SCHEDULE

All classes meet for two 70-minute and one 90-minute period each week.

COURSE LOAD

6 classes (9th and 10th grades), 5-6 classes (11th and 12th grades)

MINIMUM GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

English: 4 credits

Math: 3 credits, beginning with Algebra I (4 credits are strongly recommended)

Science & Technology: 3.5 credits, including Technology & Information Literacy [.5 credits], Conceptual Physics, Chemistry, and Biology

History: 3 credits, including U.S. History or Place-Based American Studies

Language: 2 consecutive credits in grades 9-12

Arts: 1 credit

Religion: 1 credit, Introduction to Religion and Presentation of Credal Statement

Wellness: .5 credit, Health and Fitness

Electives: 2 credits

Total required for graduation: 20 credits and 15 Hours of Community Service/Year Enrolled
