Dear Families,

The sense of synergy among our Maine Lion pride is energizing! Kids are learning about the 7 Habits and have been busy implementing the habits throughout the day. Next week we will begin our reading, writing, and math benchmarking. Benchmarking occurs three times during the school year (fall, winter, spring). Teachers use the information from these assessments to inform instruction. Between each benchmark, teachers monitor student progress and differentiate instruction as necessary to meet student needs.



Keep up to date with what your child is doing in class. Check out See Saw for teacher messages and check the Look Book or Assignment Notebook each day. If you have questions, please reach out to your child's teacher.

Last night we held our parent meeting with information about protecting and talking to children, online safety, minimizing opportunity, recognizing signs, and reacting responsibly. The presentation allowed parents to learn important information and experts were available to answer questions. If you were unable to make it to the meeting last night and are interested in learning more, please let me know. I am trying to gauge interest in offering this a second time.
