



## **Golden Bugs**

Here at our brilliant school we know that reading every day is vital to keep our brains topped up with brand new facts and that remembering what we have learnt helps our knowledge to grow at an impressive rate!

Bug Club is an amazing resource that allows every child to access both fiction and non-fiction at their reading level. The level is allocated by your child's teacher. Your child has been allocated a username and password.

Every week we will be looking to see which children have accessed the most quizzes when they have read their books and the busiest reader will be the Golden Bug for that week! These names are published in all their dazzling glory on our school newsletter for all to see!

Reading is of the utmost importance to us here at WSLPA and this brilliant resource - Bug Clubcan be used on laptops, tablets and smartphones to ensure that a book is never unavailable to our children in this busy modern world. Books accessed on Bug Club should be recorded in your child's reading record and will count towards achieving the impressive accolade of being a x7 reader.



## Opportunity to Meet your Child's Teacher

We are extremely pleased to announce the return of our informal parent drop in for term 1, allowing parents and carers to visit their child's class and meet the new teachers for this academic year just as the Reception and Doves classes have been able to do already. This year however, we will be changing the format slightly to accommodate the amount of people we have in the building at one time:

20th September - Year 1 and Year 6

21st September - Year 2 and Year 5

22<sup>nd</sup> September – Year 4

23rd September – Year 3

The session will commence at 2:30pm on the day highlighted above and will finish at 2:50pm to allow children the opportunity to prepare for the end of the school day and be collected from their usual exit doors at 3:00pm or 3:10pm depending on their finish time.

## **Y1 Handwriting Heroes**

In Year 1 we are searching for handwriting heroes each week. Every Friday your child will be sent home with a handwriting sheet to complete and return on the following Monday. These letters will be grouped by 'families' of formation.

On Monday, a handwriting hero will be chosen for each Year 1 class and their writing proudly displayed for all to see. This week the focus in 'down and off' letters.

### **IMPORTANT REMINDER**

Please be mindful when packing your child's packed lunch that it does not contain any nuts or items containing nuts or nut oils as there are children that could suffer severe allergic reactions if they were to come into contact with these.

Examples of the type of items you should avoid would be:

Peanut butter, <u>ANY</u> chocolate spread, Bueno bars, cereal / nut bars. If you are unsure of a product, kindly check the list of ingredients and avoid anything with the mention of nuts.



## Road closure for six weeks

Please note the upgrade to the gas network in Harley Shute Road will be starting 13th September until 22nd October. SGN will need to close Harley Shute Road from the junction with Harley Way to the junction of Bexhill Road. If you usually use the Bexhill Road junction, please allow additional time as this may significantly increase journey times.

## **End of day collection**

Thank you to everyone who has so far completed the online collection form via Parentmail. If you have not yet done so, please take a moment to submit your form. This helps us to know who may collect your child and helps us keep them safe.

To ensure pupils' safety and well-being it is important that their adult collects them at the correct times. Pupils in Reception, Years 1, 2, 3 and 6 are to be collected promptly at 3:00 p.m. and pupils in Years 4 and 5 at 3:10 p.m. Children can sometimes get anxious when their adults are not on time to collect them and we would like to avoid this where possible.

Please remember to allow space for teachers and children to ensure the safety of all.



Sapphire for showing a great attitude towards her learning on return to school after the summer holidays.




## Battleships PE Home Learning


