Cleveland ISD: COVID-19 Guidance - Students and Parents [2021-2022]

The purpose of this document is to provide COVID-19 guidance regarding quarantine and contact tracing for the 2021-2022 school year. As we gather new information and receive new guidance from state, local, and federal agencies, it is subject to change.

Topic	Guidance
Closed Campus	Cleveland ISD campuses will remain closed to families and visitors until further notice.
Masks/Face Coverings	Masks and Face Coverings are optional this year, but are highly encouraged.
Positive Cases	Individuals who test positive for COVID-19 MUST stay home for 10 days. Students will engage remotely for their academics.
Student Suspected Cases	Cleveland ISD offers free rapid testing at Douglass Learning Academy located at 900 Sam Wiley Drive in Cleveland. Information can be found on CISD's homepage under COVID-19 . Students with suspected cases should remain home and participate in Asynchronous Instruction.
	Follow Return to School Criteria below to determine when your student can resume class(es).

Asynchronous Instruction	If your child has tested positive for COVID-19, please reach out to the individual below at your student's campus to coordinate remote conferencing/instruction. 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Close Contact	 There will be NO contact tracing for students, faculty and staff Cleveland ISD will conduct contact tracing should circumstances deem it an appropriate action to follow. Letters will only be provided in these circumstances.
	Families of students who consider their student to be in close contact with someone infected with COVID-19: • MAY CHOOSE to quarantine their student(s) - • Individuals who exhibit no symptoms must quarantine for 10 days • Individuals who show symptoms or test positive while in quarantine must follow the Return to School Criteria • Individuals who choose to take a COVID test while in quarantine and receive a negative result on day 5 or 6 of the quarantine may return on day 7 • Fully vaccinated students are NOT considered close contact. • Individuals who tested positive for COVID-19 within three months of the reported close contact case, are NOT considered close contact
	Students who have a family member in their home diagnosed with COVID-19 are encouraged to remain home; however, it is a decision that is made by the family. Should you decide to send your student(s) to school, please isolate them from the individual who is ill and contagious.
	Should the district become aware of a student considered close contact through another public agency, the campus/department will notify the parents/guardians of the student.

Return to School Criteria	Symptomatic with No COVID-19 Test: 10 days since the onset of symptoms AND fever free for 24 hours • Should an individual test several days into their quarantine and test positive, their days begin with the date of the onset of their symptoms.
	Asymptomatic: 10 days since the positive test result
	Your student's campus can support you in determining when they should return to school.
Mitigation Practices	Cleveland ISD will continue to pursue and promote vaccination clinic opportunities for students, families, faculty, and staff Faculty and staff will continue to promote good hygiene Cleveland ISD will continue our COVID cleaning practices on all campuses
