Now through February 28th, Orange County Transit Authority (OCTA) is partnering with local schools to allow all youth ages 6-18 years old to ride the OCTA bus for free! The "Youth Ride Free" promotional pass is now available from the Orange County Transportation Authority (OCTA). Using the pass, Orange County youth ages 6 to 18 can use all OC Bus fixed-route service for free starting September 2021 until February 28, 2022.

It's an option for youth to use for travel to school, work, or for fun.

To request a Youth Ride Free pass for your child, just complete this form and return it to your child's participating school.

OCTA is able to offer the Youth Ride Free pass thanks to grant funding provided by California Climate Investments to help reduce greenhouse gas emissions, strengthen the economy, and improve public health and the environment.

FREE Meals For All Students!

Food Service K-12

Meals will be provided to ALL students free of charge again this school year and for the foreseeable future! While families are not required to complete a meal application to access these free meals, they are encouraged to complete one to qualify for the additional benefits associated with this eligibility (P-EBT card, reduction in fees for bus passes, home internet access, utilities, and AP/SAT/PSAT testing). The application remains a required document to view in the data confirmation process. Our online application program has changed this school year. We are using Titan School Solutions. The link to access the online application remains on the food service homepage, <u>http://educafe.svusd.org</u>.

Secondary Service

We WILL be using the POS computer system at both Intermediate and High Schools. Students will sanitize their hands and then proceed thru service lines (speed lines or kiosks) as they have prior to COVID. They will make their food selections and then enter their student ID number into a pin pad to be processed. Breakfast will be served at morning snack break and lunch at lunch break. We will not be selling any items a la carte to start out the year.

Responsibility is the quality of being able to fulfill duties or tasks. Responsibility involves knowing what is expected of you and doing it! Often the tasks are specific requirements, such as requests from parents, employers, or teachers. But responsibility also involves having an intuition or sense of what needs to be done and then taking the initiative to do it. The word "response" means "narwer." Thus, to a memorihal is to be able to narware "response" means "answer." Thus, to be responsible is to be able to answer to be "answerable" or accountable. *Responsibility* also includes being trustworthy, dependable, reliable, proactive, and being able to plan ahead.

Responsibility is a life skill, which does Responsibility is a life skill, which does not come naturally, but can be taught and instilled in children through training and practice! When we train our children to become responsibility inst individuals, we are helping them toward maturity. Responsibility inty just completing a task; it is also an attitude, the idea of taking action and being proud of doing it yourself.

Although we cannot always control what happens to us in our lives, we absolutely can control our response to every circumstance. As Charles Swindoll states "Life is 10% what Swindoil states, "Life is 10% what happens to us and 90% how we respond." We can choose our attitudes and how we respond to situations. We can be in control! When we realize that can be in control when we realize that we can choose our reactions to life situations, we avoid blaming others or circumstances for what happens to us and we are empowered to seize the initiative and think about solutions and meticine.

We can shape and transform our lives We can shape and transform our lives by taking complete responsibility for our actions, successes and failures, as well as choosing how we will respond to circumstances. Responsible people do what needs to be done, fulfill their commitments, and are proactive in life rehter than exercise. rather than reactive.

All persons adhere to the following rules, including those over the age of 18. Please note: THHS administration reserves the right to turn anyone away due to inappropriate dress, ie. shorts, midriffs, too revealing, etc.

Please note: 11 TICKETS:

- Tickets for all major dances are sold in the Student Store as well as on the Trabuco High School Web Store online.
- Ticket prices vary depending on whether or not a student has purchased an ASB card and when the ticket is purchased.
- Students must have a valid student ID card when they purchase their tickets and at the dance.
- If students are bringing a guest from outside of Trabuco Hills High School, they will need to submit a separate behavioral contract/permission slip when the tickets are being purchased. This permission slip will be made available for dances that allow guests, and must be completed by their high school with an official signature and business card.
- THHS Students who have been placed on the Loss of Privileges list cannot purchase a ticket to the dance until they have been removed from the list by the discipline office. List will be posted in the student store and the discipline office.
- Any non-THHS student attending the dance must attach a copy of their ID, either a driver's license or school picture ID to the permission slip. Please note: Age limit 20 years or younger, (No middle school students). NO EXCEPTIONS! Non-THHS students must have a photo ID at the dance to be admitted.
- NO refunds after purchase of a ticket.
- Trading or selling tickets is not allowed.

ADMITTANCE:

- Admittance/attendance is subject to Trabuco Hills High School Administration approval.
- Attendance at Trabuco Hills dances is a <u>privilege</u>, and not a right, which may be revoked for lack of responsibility at school including, but
 not limited to: unpaid fines, students with ourrent suspended/expulsion contracts and/or any behavioral contracts, or have lost privileges due
 to 6 or more demerits and/or attendance.
- Guests will only be admitted if they are with the THHS student who sponsored them.
- Students or guests who leave during the dance will not be readmitted.

- No student or guest will be allowed to leave the dance until an hour before the dance ends, unless prior arrangements have been approved by administration.
- <u>DO NOT BRING ANY OF THE FOLLOWING TO A DANCE</u>: Gels, liquids, aerosols, lanyards, perfume, gum, food, mints, lipstick and chapstick. Leave these items in the car or limo (these items will be confiscated at the dance).
- STUDENTS AND GUESTS MUST BE PICKED UP WITHIN 30 MINUTES AFTER THE DANCE CONCLUDES.

CONDUCT:

Dear SVUSD Community, The California Department of Public Health (CDPH) released <u>updated COVID-19</u> <u>Public Health Guidance for K-12 Schools in California, 2021-22 School Year</u>. This update provided recommendations and requirements for school-based extracurricular activities and further clarified modified quarantine recommendations.

Effective immediately, masks are required for all persons while playing all indoor sports, unless wearing a mask during play has been determined to pose a choking hazard by a well-recognized health authority, such as the American Academy of Pediatrics. For sports where wearing a mask during play has been determined to pose a choking hazard, we are required to conduct these activities outdoors or perform at least weekly screening testing with either PCR testing (1:1 or pooled PCR) or antigen testing of all individuals, including those who are fully vaccinated. Per the <u>CIF statement</u> released this morning, we have identified the sports of wrestling and competitive cheer that may be required to test weekly as the other sports mentioned are traditionally participating outdoors. More details will be provided related to testing procedures and protocols in the upcoming weeks. Schools must be in compliance with the required weekly testing no later than September 27, 2021.

Furthermore, the CDPH update along with clarification from the Orange County Health Care Agency (OCHCA) mandates a student identified as a close contact to have no participation in extracurricular activities at school, including sports, and activities within the community setting for 14 days following the last exposure.

CDPH will continue to assess conditions on an ongoing basis, and will determine no later than November 1, 2021, whether to update mask requirements or recommendations.
