RE: COVID and in-person learning

Over the past two weeks, district administrators have communicated with hundreds of families regarding COVID mitigation efforts, masks and positive COVID-19 cases. Most of our interactions revolve around the wearing of masks in school. The position of the district continues to be clearly stated. All students, staff and visitors must wear masks as outlined in the August 31st Department of Health Secretary's Order, unless that individual has a documented section 3.B exemption. Masks and the lawfulness of face-coverings is contentious. Sides are polarized and our students are caught in the middle. Regardless of personal, political, medical or legal belief's, the district must continue to enforce this order. The PA Departments of Health and Education are beginning to push for school exclusion for non-compliance. The mask Order extends to all afterschool activities, including spectators at indoor athletic events.

The district is also required to **case investigate and contact trace** each positive student and staff COVID-19 case. Our results are electronically reported to the PA DoH. Resulting close contacts are quarantined, which means exclusion from in-person learning. We believe that in-person is best for PENNCREST students, their families, and our community.

As of today, we have **70 laboratory confirmed positive COVID-19 cases**. We are fortunate that none of our cases have resulted in death or extended hospital stays. Last year, we had a total of 155 laboratory confirmed positive COVID-19 cases. We are on track to exceed this number by Halloween.

Please continue to work positively with our teachers, principals, and staff now and throughout the 21-22 school year. We need unity and cooperation to continue uninterrupted in-person learning.
