



We recognise that our pupils are talented and accomplished in a wide range of skills. We embrace a breadth of ability and support each and every pupil to achieve the very best they can.

Our academic standards are high across a broad curriculum and pupils are stretched without being stressed, to achieve their potential and personal best. We encourage ambition and achievement of every kind, whether it's in the classroom, in sport or in artistic expression.

Success is not just about grades and academic skills. We put an equal emphasis on personal development, helping young people to build confidence and independence, to take responsibility and initiative, and learn important communication, teamwork and leadership skills.

Academically ambitious

Our impressive academic record includes a 100% A level pass rate with 36% achieving A*A grades and 46% of GCSE candidates achieving A*A equivalent (grade 7-9). 81% of our final year students received an offer from a Russell Group university.


