
## RETURN TO SCHOOL CRITERIA Exposure to Covid

Asymptomatic Individuals

This chart outlines the path to a return to school when a student or faculty member has been exposed to an individual or household member who is 1) symptomatic or 2) has a confirmed case of COVID.

An unvaccinated student may return after a minimum of 5 days from last exposure to a COVID-positive individual, provided that no symptoms develop or as instructed by DC Health. **Note:** Returning to school after 5 days (on day 6) is only acceptable if:

- 1. The student does not develop symptoms of COVID at any point during the 5 days AND
- 2. The student takes a rapid antigen test, NAAT or PCR-equivalent test on or after day 5 and receives a negative result AND
- 3. The student continues to self-monitor for symptoms until 14 days after the last exposure to the COVID positive person.

## SYMPTOMS / AWAITING RESULTS

When an unvaccinated student has a household member who is symptomatic or awaiting a COVID test result, they may return to school after the household member receives a negative test result, as long as the student has no symptoms. If the household member receives a positive test result, the student should follow instructions for being exposed to someone with a confirmed case.
