Charlotte Christian School is a Christ-centered, college preparatory, independent, non-denominational school serving students in grades JK-12. Founded in 1950, the school is celebrating 70 years of excellence in education. Our vision for students includes the integration of Biblical principles where character, values and essential practical skills are emphasized and modeled; a rigorous academic program is offered; lifetime fitness and athletics are encouraged; and a fine arts program where creative expression is nurtured. GPA CALCULATION

Grade point average (GPA) is based on a 4.0 scale, with the exception that honors courses receive 0.5 extra quality point and AP 500 level courses receive 1.0 extra quality point. All (CCS) upper school courses are included in the calculation of GPA. If a student enters Charlotte Christian with credits from another high school, a transcript from the previous high school will be enclosed with the CCS transcript. Those grades are not included in the CCS cumulative GPA calculation.

The academic year is comprised of two semesters. Transcripts are updated in June at the conclusion of each academic year.

COVID-19

Charlotte Christian transitioned to online school in March 2020 through the end of the academic year. In-person 90-minute classes were reduced to 80-minute online classes using a combination of synchronous and asynchronous instruction. Curriculum and assessments were modified (including the elimination of final exams), but grades were issued. The 2020-21 academic year provided inperson instruction, allowing students to opt for study at home at their own discretion. In the upper school, less than 10% of students opted for at-home instruction during the 2020-21 academic year. The option for at-home instruction has not been offered for the 2021-22 academic year.







ACADEMIC CONSERVATORY PROGRAM

Charlotte Christian School recognizes that students are gifted in a variety of areas, including academics, athletics, fine arts, or spiritual life. The Academic Conservatory Program provides a special opportunity for students in academics, fine arts or ministry to challenge and stretch themselves beyond the four walls of the classroom. Conservatory achievement is noted on the student's transcript in the fall and spring of senior year upon completion of all requirements. From the Class of 2021, 17% of graduates qualified for at least one conservatory distinction.

SEAL OF BILITERACY

Beginning in 2019, CCS implemented the Seal of Biliteracy to recognize students for high achievement in multicultural education, based on a proficiency exam in the areas of listening, speaking, reading and writing in two languages. The prestigious endorsement is evidence of the student's ongoing commitment to long-term language learning and cultural awareness. From the Class of 2021, 11% of graduates earned this distinction.

During the college application process we expect and advise students to self-disclose disciplinary infractions occurring during grades 9-12 that result in out-of-school suspension.






