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- Use classroom and furniture layouts to accomplish this
 - 2.0 Activity Programs
 - Fitness/Health Lab
 - fitness and weights can be combined into a single space
 - Perhaps bike stations in STEM labs?
 - Currently indoor basketball is available in the gym. Add an outdoor court space but not required indoors due to limited clear height.
 - Gym equipment that uses technology to simulate various ways to have competition
 - Art Lab
 - Current project storage is limited so dedicated storage is desired.
 - DAT really liked the idea of professionally displaying art
 - DAT liked project storage shelves within glass partition
 - Audio/Visual Production Space for music production
 - Re-imagine the music room. Desire for a non-traditional music space to include green screen, recording studio, practice/teaching area, etc. There is not a traditional orchestra or band program, more of a “School of Rock” type program.
 - Photography Program
 - Provide space for about 10 students to use dark room area
 - Traditional and digital photography opportunities should be provided for
 - General Comments
 - Desire for every teaching space to have some type of connection to the outdoors via garage door, large window, view through spaces to outdoors, etc. DAT recognize that not all spaces can have direct outdoor access but view and daylight should be provided.
 - Desire for operable windows in each space
 - Don’t currently have a student store but a kiosk would be desirable.
 - Reviewed available spaces for Advisory rooms, the current program includes 10 classrooms, 3 science labs, 1 art studio, 1 photography studio, 1 music production studio, 1 STEM lab, 1 health/fitness studio that can all be used for Advisory. This is a total of 18 spaces. This does not include the currently allocated 6 seminar rooms.
 - Auditorium seating capacity is 350.
 - New Vista needs to have an expansion plan for up to 500 students. The expansion could be in a separate, adjacent building as an option.
