Principal's Message

August 25, 2021

Dear Students, Families and Staff,

The new school year is in the air! It has been great fun to see our seniors coming in to pick up their senior t-shirts and Senior Privilege Forms over the last few weeks. It has been equally as exciting to see Fall Sports get started and new staff coming in to get acclimated and ready for a new school year in a new district. You can read more about these excellent hires in this newsletter. Departments have been coming in to work together on curriculum. Student Services opened for the fall on Monday, August 23, and they have been registering new students and tweaking schedules as needed. Scarborough High School is once again becoming a busy place. On Tuesday, August 24, we held building tours for interested students and families and they were well attended. We have more tours planned for tomorrow and I'm sure they will be busy too.

We are opening back up and it feels good to be headed in that direction! While the Delta variant is keeping us masked, I have every confidence that we can make this work. Being back in person five days a week is where we'd hoped to be. Protocols are still in place to keep everyone safe. We are still utilizing three areas for eating at lunch – the cafeteria, the main lobby and the rear auditorium, and we are QR coding at each table for each lunch block for contact tracing, if needed. We are still asking students and staff to "stay to the right" in the hallways. With a few exceptions, we have capped classes at 21. Things have been planned for safety for all.

Some new additions have been developed to add to our offerings at the high school. Summer 2021 was the first time in my memory that SHS offered summer school. This was a successful endeavor. This fall, we have a new one-year teacher position focused on Response to Intervention (RTI) and credit recovery support and we hope that this will be a great resource for some students still getting back on track. Our Advisory Program this year (two meetings per month) will be focused on Social Emotional Learning (SEL) and each grade level will have a curriculum specifically designed for their grade.

Some information for parents. We will be in person for our Open House on Tuesday, September 21, from 6:00 - 8:15 PM. Fall Parent-Teacher Conferences are planned for Thursday, October 14, 2:45 – 7:15 PM and Thursday, October 28, 2:45 – 5:15 PM. These will also be in person. Sign up for conferences opens up on Wednesday, September 29, at 6:00 AM. There is more information in this newsletter telling you how to sign up. Lastly, the first quarter Parent Meeting will be held Wednesday, October 20, at 6:00 PM, in the All-Purpose Room and an agenda will be sent out prior to the meeting. I hope that everyone has a strong start to the school year and I look forward to seeing you soon!

2022 SAT UPDATE

2022 School Day SAT Update

After several years, the Maine DOE has shifted away from using the SAT Exam as a statewide assessment for 3rd year high school students and is no longer requiring schools to administer it each spring. As a result, Scarborough High School will not be administering the SAT Exam during the 2021-2022 school year.

Any SHS students wishing to take the SAT Exam for college admissions purposes should plan to register for their own exam at <https://collegereadiness.collegeboard.org/sat>. The exam is offered at various testing locations throughout the Southern Maine area on the first Saturday of each month (*except for January, February, & April*) during the 2021-2022 school year.

Fee waivers are available for any SHS student who qualifies, and students should see either Student Services or Senior Placement for more info.

Important Immunization Update

At last count, we have 47 students who are not fully vaccinated with the required immunizations for students enrolled in grades K-12. These Immunizations include five DPT/DTap, two MMR, four IPV/OPV, one or two Varicella, one Tdap, and one or two MCV4. (This list does not include the Covid vaccination). There is a new state law in place requiring students attending school to be fully vaccinated with the above referenced vaccines. Families of students missing required vaccinations have received reminders from the school notifying them that there is a deadline of November 26, 2021 for these required vaccines. If you have a student who has not yet met these vaccination requirements, please contact the clinic to advise them of your plan and timeline for your student to be fully vaccinated. You may reach the Clinic by calling 730-5015 or 730-5016. We are certainly hopeful that these deadlines will be met to avoid any student not being able to attend school for this reason. CLINIC NOTES Fall 2021

CLINIC SET UP: We have two clinics set up at the high school again this year. One clinic will be used for routine care and the second clinic will be used for students/staff who feel ill.

IMMUNIZATIONS: Please send updated immunization records to the clinic whenever your student receives a required vaccine. In addition to the vaccines required for kindergarten entry, a Tdap and one dose of MCV4 is required for all students entering 7th grade. Two doses of MCV4 are required for students entering 12th grade. If the first dose of MCV4 was administered on or after the 16th birthday, a second dose is not required.

MEDICATION DROP OFF: Please contact the clinic to plan for medication drop off.

FLU SHOT CLINIC: Flu season is rapidly approaching, and we plan to partner with Northern Light Home Care again this year to offer a flu shot clinic. More information will follow.

HEALTH: Please contact the clinic staff if your child has a health issue (acute or chronic) or sustains a physical injury that may require accommodations while at school.

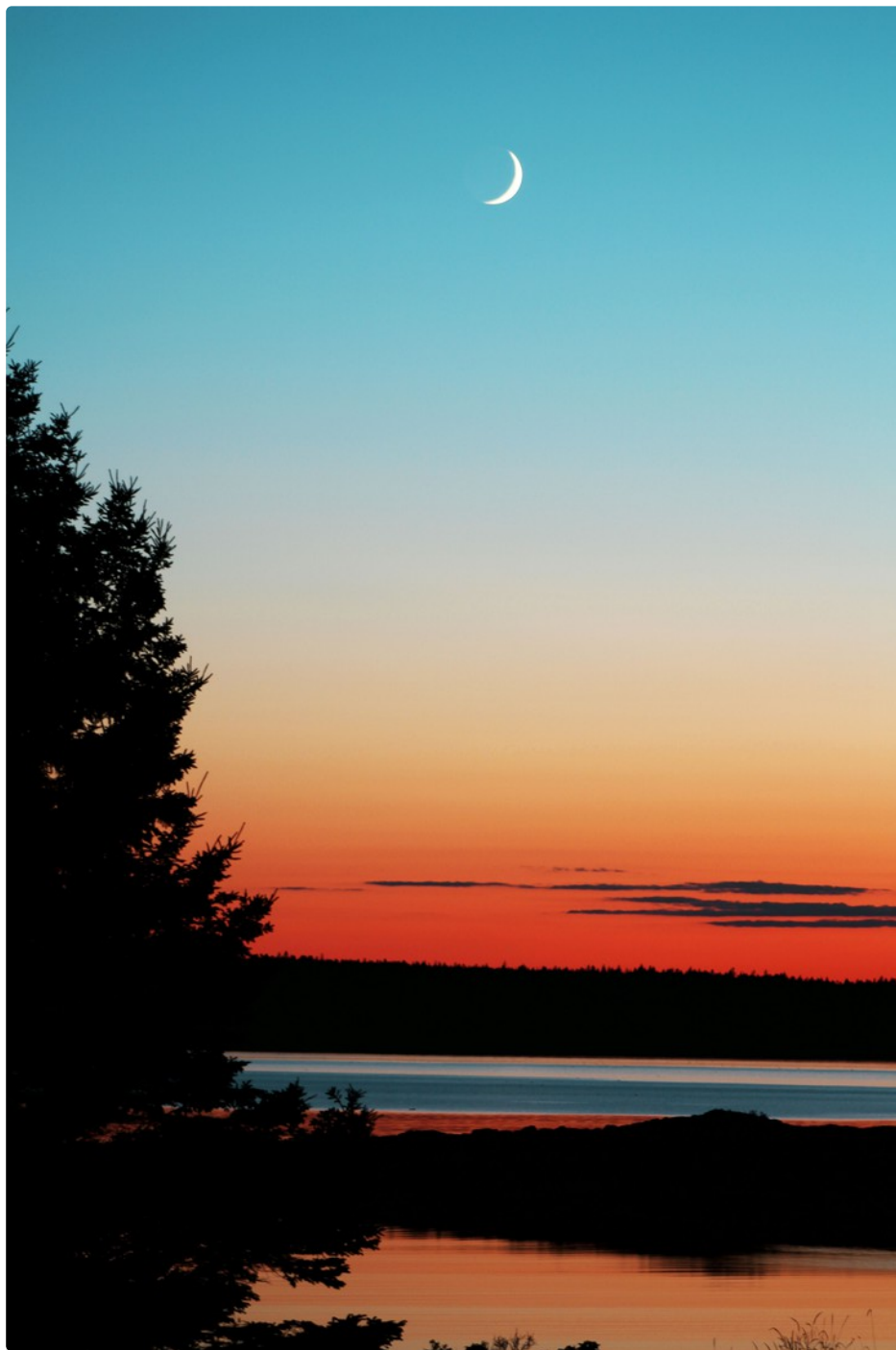
