Students may bring an individual healthy snack to eat during the school day. Classroom teachers will schedule snack-time and it will vary according to each grade level's schedule. Please send healthy, nut-free items that do not include soda, candy, or sweets (no donuts, cupcakes, etc). Click here for suggestions

Peanut butter, nut-granola bars, and other nut items can be eaten during lunchtime (in the lunchroom) but NOT in the classroom during snack time. (We will help you remember these details)



Sending a Birthday Day treat for your child's classroom is allowed this year but not required. It is a personal choice for each family. Since the treat is intended to be shared with other children, there are strict guidelines to follow. Shared treats much be:

- 1. Store-bought (no homemade items)
- 2. Wrapped and individually sealed from the store. (no bakery box full of cupcakes, please)
- 3. Nut-free Click here for suggestions but still check the label
- 4. A clear, readable ingredient label

Check with your child's teacher for any other restrictions that may pertain to your child's classroom.

Dear Wausau School District Families,

Wausau School District is participating in the USDA Seamless Summer Option (SSO) for the entirety of the 2021-22 school year. This means that our school is providing *free* meals (breakfast and lunch) to all students! This program provides additional support and flexibility for our district to continue serving meals to children while maintaining safety measures and managing the impacts of the COVID-19 pandemic. Even though receipt of free meals does not depend on an approved free and reduced-price meal application, we are still distributing and processing them so Wausau School District families may qualify for P-EBT benefits as well as other school funding.

When your child participates in our healthy and delicious school meals program it will save your family time and money. At breakfast, all children are offered at least four food items from three food components (grain, fruit, and fluid milk) and at lunch are offered five food components (grain, protein, fruit, vegetable, and fluid milk). For your child's breakfast to be free, they must take at least three food items, one of which is ½ cup fruit or vegetable. For your child's lunch meal to be free, they must take at least three different food components, one of which is ½ cup fruit or vegetable. At the secondary school levels only: Purchases such as second entrees, milk only, or other food items that do not meet the requirements described above will be charged. These ala carte purchases will require a positive meal account balance in PayPams.

We are required to notify all households of the District's Low Balance Policy which can be found here Policy 8500.
