DEFENSE LEADS IRISH PAST LOYOLA; GIRLS XC TAKES FIRST AT AVERILL DISTANCE MEET

BOYS SOCCER FINISHES 2-1 AT ANNUAL TOURNAMENT

The Notre Dame Boys Varsity Soccer team finished 2-1 at an annual tournament with Groves, Flushing, and Frankenmuth. The Irish began the day with an impressive 2-1 win over Birmingham Groves. Connor McGlynn had a first half goal with Jeronimo Ballesty picking up an assists and Ballesty would score the deciding goal himself in the second half. In the second game, Notre Dame picked up a 3-1 win over Flushing. Santino Bidawid, Massimo Vitale and Joey Liparoto all scored in the win while Jake Lanham and Vitale added assists. In the final match of the day, the Irish fell 1-0 to host Frankenmuth.

IRISH PLACE SEVENTH AT ORANGETHEORY INVITE

The Notre Dame Girls Varsity Golf team took seventh overall and first amongst Division Three teams at the OrangeTheory Invite played at Hudson Mills Golf Course. The Irish finished with a team score of 424 strokes on the day. The balanced Notre Dame scoring effort was led by Emily Szalach, who medaled with a 103. Brooklyn Haddad (105), Brooke Cousins (107), and Amanda Roth (109) also factored into the scoring for the Irish.

GIRLS TAKE FIRST, BOYS SEVENTH AT AVERILL INVITE

The Notre Dame Girls and Boys Varsity Cross Country teams competed at the Averill Invitational at the difficult Kensington Metro Park course over the weekend. The Girls Varsity team placed first overall in the silver division (medium sized schools with enrollment between 1,000 and 1,500), edging out Mercy by one point. Zoe Hoke (second), Maria Nunning (third),

Erin Connelly (seventh) and Kate Stacey (17th) all earned medals in the process. Nicole Carson, finishing just three spots from a medal, rounded out the scoring for the Irish who notched their first invitational victory of the season. Skylar Vanhecke and Ally Heaman medaled in the JV race. For the Boys, Wade Robinson won his first race of the season and posted the second fastest time for a sophomore in all divisions with a time of 17:47 on a course that features one of the biggest hills the team will face this season. Featuring a lineup that included four freshman and two sophomores, the Irish finished a respectable seventh out of 15 teams. Junior Captain Ben Kinkade and sophomore Troy Kilanowski ran season bests turning in strong performances with times of and 20:26 and 21:07, respectively. Freshmen Ryan Wojichowski, Isaac Brook, Sam Phillips, and Nick Mardelli all ran personal bests at the invitational. For Mardelli, it was his first varsity race. Next up for the Irish is the 53rd annual Duane Raffin Festival of Races at Springfield Oaks County Park in Davisburg.

DEFENSE PACES IRISH IN WIN OVER LOYOLA

The Notre Dame Varsity Football team moved to 3-0 season, defeating Detroit Loyola 23-8 in a battle of ranked teams. The Bulldogs jumped out to an early 6-0 lead, scoring on their opening possession (extra point was blocked). Loyola would maintain the lead into the second quarter until the Irish turned defense into offense. Johnny Dreer returned an interception nine yards for a Notre Dame score to put the Irish up 7-6 and Evan McGhee would record an interception on the next Loyola drive. After the Notre Dame drive stalled out, a punt down to the one yard line would set up an Evan Noga safety to increase the lead to 9-6.

Heading into halftime, Jacob Tuttle would find Billy Newman for a 25 yard passing score to put Notre Dame up 16-6 at the break. In the third quarter, the Bulldogs would get a safety of their own to make it a one score game, but early in the fourth quarter Tuttle would connect with Dreer for a six vard score to put the win away. The Notre Dame defense finished with three interceptions on the evening, coming from Dreer, who added eight tackles, McGhee, and Walter DeCasas, who also had six tackles and four pass breakups. Defensive ends Alex Scherle and Evan Noga continued their strong campaigns by combining for 10 sacks. Tuttle had 108 passing yards and Newman led all receivers with 75 yards. McGhee ran for 105 yards on 18 carries while Jeremy Gale added 36 yards through the air on a trick play.




Johnny Dreer returns a second quarter interception for a touchdown as the Irish defeated Loyola 23-8

VOLLEYBALL WINS BC LAKEVIEW TOURNAMENT; GIRLS SWIM TAKES FIRST AT SMISL RELAY MEET

IRISH EARN THIRD TOURNAMENT WIN OF SEASON

The Notre Dame Varsity Volleyball team took its third tournament title of the season, going unbeaten at the Battle Creek Lakeview Invite. The Irish opened the tournament with a convincing 25-10, 25-9 win over Vicksburg. Aly Borellis had two aces, five kills and 12 assists while Grace Wenaas had five kills and Bianca Giglio added four kills, nine points (six aces), and a pair of digs. Josie Bloom anchored the defense with seven digs and seven serve receptions while teammate Ally Berent served up 12 points (four aces) and six digs. Next in pool play the Irish took on perennial Division Four power Battle Creek St Phillip and jumped out to an early lead on their way to a 25-11, 25-17 victory. Borellis collected seven kills, dished out eight assists and had five digs. Sophia Sudzina chipped in five kills while Margo Sudzina added five points and 11 assists. Berent (11 points, five receptions and eight digs) and Bloom (six receptions and six digs) helped slow the Tiger offense down. The final pool matchup saw Notre Dame defeat Kalamazoo Central 25-11, 25-9. Defensive specialist Hanna Rutila led all scorers with nine points and four aces while Bloom collected 10 more digs. Wenaas had eight kills, Borellis had four kills, 10 assists and 12 digs, and fellow setter Margo Sudzina added 13 assists and three digs. Leah Greif made several strong defensive plays while Abby Nellis, Giglio, and Sophia Sudzina all had three kills for the Irish. In the elimination round the Irish faced off against Division Two fifth ranked Cadillac. After a slow start, Notre Dame pulled away for a 25-12, 25-9 win. Berent was tough from the service line, scoring 14 times, including five aces, to go with 13 digs. Bloom added nine more digs and 11 serve receptions while Borellis finished

with nine service points, 12 kills, 13 assists and 11 digs. Margo Sudzina had 11 assists with Giglio (five kills) and Sophia Sudzina (seven) also helping to pace the offense. Notre Dame was tested in both the semifinal and final rounds. In the semifinal, host Battle Creek Lakeview battled the Irish, but ultimately Notre Dame prevailed with a 25-21, 30-28 win. Berent and Bloom kept the Irish in the match with nine and eight digs and 10 and 22 receptions respectively while Berent added eight more service points. Greif came off of the bench to collect a couple of important digs to help preserve the win. Sophia Sudzina continued to be a force at the net with a team high 15 kills. Margo Sudzina had 19 assists and Borellis contributed nine kills, and 13 assists. In the championship match, Notre Dame took on Portage Northern. The Huskies played outstanding defense to slow the Irish attack and led by as many as five points in the opening set before the Irish defense took control. Nellis (5 five kills and a pair of blocks) collected the last to kills to seal the first set win at 26-24. The Irish completed the match with a 25-14 win in the final set. Bloom added 11 more receptions and 10 digs, Berent had seven points, 14 receptions, and 10 digs and Margo Sudzina dished out 15 assists. Sophia Sudzina was virtually unstoppable in the final match as she rung up 14 kills and had five digs while Borellis finished with nine points, six kills, 13 assists and six digs.

IRISH IMPRESS IN WIN OVER TROY ATHENS

The Notre Dame Girls JV Golf team finished with their best round of the season in a 189-208 win over Troy Athens at Crystal Lake. Three Irish golfers set personal records; Ashley Larimer with a 42, Elise Glotkowski with a 50, and Alex Triantos with a 50. Larimer finished with three pars for the match while Triantos started off the night with a par on the first hole. Megan Fitzpatrick was strong from the tee box while Audrey Thurman exhibited a strong short game. Larimer and Morgan Bissett hit several key long putts in the match to help lead Notre Dame to the win.

NOTRE DAME TAKES FIRST AT SMISL MEET

The Notre Dame Girls Varsity Swim and Dive team captured a first place finish at the SMISL Relay meet held at Adrian High School. The Irish finished with a total of 546 points, edging out second place Temperance Bedford (532) by 14 points. Notre Dame started off the day with a first place finish in the 200 Yard Medley Relay by Olivia Powell, Emma Ciesla, Alina Stanczak, and Rita Hajjar. The team of Grace Linenfelser, Lauren Chojnacki, Tessa Boehme, and Ella Warner also took third in the same event. In the 200 Freestyle Relay, Hannah Hutchinson, Lexie Hunter, Aria Kim, and Elizabeth Gruden combined to take second place while the team of Hunter, Powell, Stanczak, Gruden, and Katie Schmidt took first in the 5X100 Relay. In second place through nine events, the Irish used back-to-back first place finished in the final two relays to take the team title. The team of Ciesla, Linenfelser, and Gruden placed first in the 3X200 Free Relay and the team of Stanczak, Boehme, Tori Devine, and Ciesla finished first in the 4X50 Under/Over Relay to seal the victory.
