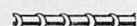
EXPANDED SPACE AND OPPORTUNITY FOR OUR HIGH SCHOOL YOUTH



The new addition to the high school provides needed space and modern equipment for the teaching of the sciences, (physics, chemistry, biology and general science), the industrial arts, music, and mathematics.

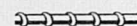
We believe that with these up-to-date facilities to aid them our dedicated teachers will be able to lead our students to a high level of educational experience.

The new addition provides about 36,000 square feet of floor space on three floors. The top floor is devoted to the sciences; the second floor to mathematics and group teaching, and the first floor to music and the industrial arts.



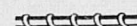
