
DEDICATION MEMORIAL HIGH SCHOOL

MEMORIAL HIGH SCHOOL typifies the best style of construction and arrangement. Besides regular classrooms, there are four Locker rooms, a Suite of Science rooms consisting of a Lecture room, a Physics Laboratory, a Chemical Laboratory, Preparation room, and storerooms. There are other special rooms, such as Manual Training, Drawing, Commerical, Typewriting, Study Hall, Library, Medical room, Teachers' Rest Room, Board Room, and Executive Offices.

THE AUDITORIUM seats about 800 and contains a perfectly appointed stage with footlights and border lights. Four dressing rooms

adjoin the stage. A fireproof booth for a moving-picture machine is also provided.

THE GYMNASIUM is located underneath the Auditorium and contains a gallery which will seat bout 150. Modern apparatus is installed, making a thoroughly up-to-date exercise room.

THE ELECTRIC WIRING is thoroughly modern, all being contained in iron conduits. Two large fans furnish fresh air taken from above the roof tor ventilating the building. The ventilation of the Auditorium and Gymnasium is separate from the rest of the building. By means of regulating dampers, air can be either recirculated or expelled through ventilators in the roof. Heating is controlled by thermostatic regulators in every room. A Master Clock controls all clocks, including the Tower Clock and also rings the program bells. A Telephone Switchboard connects with each room in the building and with each of the other schools. A vacuum cleaning system insures cleanliness.

THE BUILDING was designed by Tooker and Marsh, Architects. The general construction was done by George T. Kelly; heating and ventilating by the Johnston Heating Company; electric wiring by the Van Wagoner-Lynn Construction Company; plumbing by Joseph F. Cunneen; furnishing and fixtures were supplied by the following firms and individuals:
