Dear Parents and Carers

Welcome to our Friday newsletter, which again has found the academy to be with its foot firmly on the learning and engaging pedal.

I must immediately pay tribute to our students and to our parents and carers who have supported the brilliant standard of uniform.

Daily they steadily engage in learning our students who need their additional and specialist support. The progress in confidence and ability is evident and the positive relationships developed with these vital staff, boosts self esteem and self-worth. Our Teaching Assistants are invaluable and the academy could not function without them. I was delighted to help celebrate National Teaching Assistants Day, this week and we have some fabulous photographs of our valiant crew within this letter.

On Wednesday we met, virtually, representatives from our parent and carer community who attend our Parent Forum Group. We hold this evening once a term, where we share key strategies and updates and enables academy-based questions to be raised by our attendees. This week, Mr Sadler presented the great work of our Covid Testing Team, an analysis of our Year 11 GCSE and BTEC examination results and an explanation of our Key Stage 3 Assessment process. Measuring Progress and Attainment

Students and Academies will be measured on how much progress they make from when they start in Year 7 to when they complete their exams at the end of Year 11. This will be known as Progress 8 The Progress 8 measure is designed to encourage all students to study a broad and balanced curriculum. measure will be based on students' progress measured across eight subjects.

For each student the 8 subjects must be a combination from the diagram below.



The Progress 8 score will always be determined by dividing the points total by 10 (the eight qualifications with English and Mathematics counting double), regardless of how many qualifications your child sits or in which subjects.

Year 11 and Year 10 Parent and Carer GCSE & BTEC Course and Examination Information Presentations

We would like to highlight to our parents and carers of our Key Stage 4 students that we will be presenting GCSE and BTEC information evenings, virtually, as below.

While we are delighted to welcome our children into the academy and back into their pastoral houses, we are still mindful of the ever-present pandemic knocking at all our doors. With this in mind, we have taken the decision to continue to secure our protective measures, that we will conduct the above two evenings remotely, online.

This will serve many purposes, for at these evenings, as good as it is to listen to our subject experts, it is always a challenge to remember every slide and the emphasis on the 'musts' and 'ensure you do' comments and golden nuggets within conversation, therefore, presenting these as pre-recorded information gives parents, carers and students the opportunity to view and review this vital information, at leisure or when reassurance is needed. This also enables conversations to be held with students, by our parents and carers about the learning taking place and our expectations and for questions to be raised with our subject teachers or leaders, where needed.

<u>Thursday 23rd September</u> is our **Year 11 Information Evening**, where you will have chance to hear from both the school leadership and key department heads, ensuring you and your child are aware of all the support available to them in Year 11 in the lead up to their exams and completion of coursework.

<u>Thursday 30th September</u> is our **Year 10 Information Evening**, where again key heads of department will be available to help support you and your child as they enter their GCSE courses.

As always our staff are hear to support your child and our parents and carers, when needed. DFE Information: COVID-19 vaccine update for 12 to 15 year olds

This autumn, all young people aged 12 to 15 are being offered a first dose of the COVID-19 vaccine. Vaccinating young people should help to reduce the need for young people to have time off school and should reduce the risk of spread of COVID-19 within schools. The main purpose of the COVID-19 childhood vaccination programme is therefore to provide protection to the young people who receive the vaccine and to reduce the disruption to face-to-face education this winter.

Like all school-based vaccination programmes, the School Age Immunisation Service (SAIS) team will be the primary provider of the vaccination programme and will be legally responsible for the delivery of the vaccine. More information on the COVID-19 vaccine, the vaccination programme and how it will work, as well as answers to some frequently asked questions, is included in the Public Health England quidance for schools.

<u>NHS leaflets</u> are available to provide more information to parents, carers and eligible young people on the vaccine, including how it works and what to expect after having the vaccine. Accessible versions and translations are also available.

Road Safety

On behalf of the safety and welfare of all the community, can I please ask that you do not drop your child off within the near vicinity of the academy. You will know it is on a busy road, with a crossing, two bus stops and an additional road running parallel with Rye Road, with a dangerous entrance/exit for cars to navigate. Please do not park or drop your child anywhere near the zigzags, parked cars, crossing or bus stops, for the traffic thunders past, buses pull out and we do not wish for anyone to get hurt.

In addition, if you choose to drive your child onto the school premises, again, I kindly ask you not to drop your child near the zebra crossing. Should you have to drop your child please drive to the top, where the drop-off area is located and wait until there is a safe space. Your patience relating to this is very much appreciated.

I would also be very grateful if you could kindly instil into your child that they must cross over the Rye Road using the official crossing areas, only and when they do, to only cross the road when they hear the 'beeps'

Too often some students think it is good enough to run across the road. I have to reinforce with you the dangers this brings, not only to your child, but to the driver/s of the vehicles involved and any staff members, who have to manage the situation.

At the end of the day, with staff in attendance, there was a near miss purely because the red light and beep were ignored. Thankfully, no harm was caused, however staff and students and driver who witnessed this are rightly shaken by the prospect of what could have been.

We all have to play our part in doing our level best to avoid an accident. The students will be reminded, again, during tutor time, next week.





The MFL department will invite pupils to celebrate and promote the rich linguistic diversity and raise awareness of the importance of lifelong language learning for everyone.


Special assembly , international food at the canteen, and activities during the week starting 20th September,

You will see within this letter notice of the government's intention to use schools as a base for Covid vaccinations. I will always share what I need to with you, but I do need to advise that no child will be forced to have a vaccination against their will or that of their parent or carer. Consent is consent. It is not the academy's business to engage with consent issues. This is between the child, NHS, carer and parent. The academy, as with all vaccination programmes (for example HPV), will only enable administration upon consent.
