Olympian Tom George Visits

We were delighted and very honoured to welcome Olympian rower Tom George to Yateley Manor on Friday. Tom gave an inspiring talk in assembly to Years 1 to 4 and then to Years 5 to 8 about his journey to Olympic bronze in Tokyo 2020.

Although winning his bronze medal in the coxed eight was the pinnacle of his career Tom says that he quickly realised that "it has nothing to do with the destination and everything to do with the journey to reach it".

He told the children that setbacks happen and it is how you deal with them that matters. During COVID lockdowns he exchanged his normal beautiful training

settings for a rowing machine inside his parents' shed but was determined to keep on track. His efforts paid off when he became the first Briton to break 5.40 for the 2000m erg test and only the ninth in the world! Tom left the children with three messages. The first is to take on every challenge that you can. Continued on page 5.

It was a privilege to welcome Tom George, Olympic Bronze medallist, to school this morning. Following his success at the Tokyo Olympics he spoke passionately about his experiences as part of the GB Team and the highs and lows along the way. His messages resonated with our school values.

Tom attended the Dragon School in Oxfordshire before moving to Radley and then the United States where he studied at Princeton University. His desire to become

an Olympic athlete started at school where he was encouraged to join the rowing club. Talking about his career, he explained to the children that the journey to success was just as important as the destination, and that they should take a step back from time to time to savour the moment.

Mr Michael our Gardener

Michael White is a very long-standing member of the Yateley Manor Maintenance Team and is currently our school gardener. Michael

was diagnosed with Type 1 Diabetes when he was eleven years old and Bechet's Syndrome (a rare auto immune treatment which causes damage to veins and arteries) some time later. Despite lots of different treatments Michael had both his arms and both his legs amputated several years ago.

Never one to be defeated he returned to work a couple of years ago and is responsible for the displays of flowers around the school. He is a popular member of the school family and is very involved in the school. Last term Mr Michael, as he is known, took the Reception children on a tour of the flowers, teaching them their names, and also organised our annual sunflower growing competition.

Michael now has the opportunity to receive a Hero bionic arm – making him the first Yateley Manor bionic man! This would hugely improve his quality of life, allowing him to hold a fishing rod again, hold his dog's lead and something as simple as an apple. A friend has set up a <u>Go Fund Me page</u> to help him raise the money for this life changing prosthetic. We know he would be deeply grateful for any contributions.
