Schedule - Drop Off - Pick Up

School Hours

- 8:15-8:30 Student arrival and breakfast
- School is in session from 8:30am 3:30pm
- The tardy bell rings at 8:35am.

Student Arrival and Morning Procedures

- Students may arrive between 8:15-8:30am.
- There is no supervision prior to 8:15am.
- Students will be welcomed at the door by staff members and begin their day in their classrooms.
- Parents may drop students off in the North parking lot. Buses will unload in front of the school. We ask parents to remain in

their vehicle and have students exit the passenger side of the car.

• Breakfast will be provided to students in their classrooms between 8:15-8:40 each day.

Additional Student Arrival and Dismissal Details

Please share this information with anyone who might be dropping off or picking up your child up at school. Parent pickup occurs at the North entrance of the building. The main entrance is used only for bus students.

- 1. Follow the designated traffic flow.
- 2. Observe a 5mph speed limit.
- 3. If you are the first vehicle in line, please pull forward to the handicap stall.
- 4. Stay in your vehicle and have children exit from the passenger side of the vehicle next to school.
- 5. For safety, no double parking in the drop off/pick up line.
- 6. If you are going to exit your car, please park in a parking stall and walk your child to/from school. Children are not allowed to walk in the parking lot without an adult.

Refrain from using your cell phone while driving in our lot.
