

As a last resort, we might have to exercise the eminentdomain option, which allows us to take over private property for public use with fair-market compensation to the owner.

### What's next?

Specific to the four new schools funded by the 2016 bond, we have identified three preferred pieces of property that each have complex paths asked: Why don't you plan ahead and build to acquisition:

• Issaquah Highlands property (new elementary): In partnership with City of Issaquah staff, we have identified a piece of property adjacent to Swedish Hospital in the Issaquah Highlands. The City Council in early October annexed the land from King County and rezoned a portion to allow for a school facility. Now comes negotiations to buy the land and permit the school.

- **Providence Heights** property (new high school and elementary): We have begun the eminent-domain process to acquire this large piece of land in northern Issaquah from its current owner, the City Church of Kirkland. In the meantime, the City Church's demolition permit was blocked by a successful petition to designate the entire site as a historic landmark. We are awaiting the final verdict as the City Church appeals.
- ISD Administration Building property (new middle school): We plan to move our administrative offices to a corporate building in order to build on this centrally located piece of land in Issaguah. We have worked with the city to secure land-use variances necessary to fit a middle school on the site. Design work will now begin, followed by permitting. The deal is also contingent on our completion of an eminent-domain action to acquire the corporate building for administrative space.

#### Growth management: Getting ahead of the curve, but not too far

With new facilities like Clark Elementary opening with multiple portables, we often are excess space in anticipation of growth?

Our top fiscal concern is carefully predicting enrollment numbers and planning for rightsized resources like staffing and class space but we can't get too far ahead. As one of the fastest growing districts in the state (gaining more than 500 students annually, the equivalent of a good-sized elementary), our goal is to build space to keep pace with

on a per-child basis, we funnel money away from classroom learning if we pay overhead for excess building space. It's the same reason airlines can't stay solvent flying planes with empty seats.

Growth is the triggering factor for us to collect developer impact fees and sell bonds for construction. As our student-growth predictions crystalize into actual enrollment numbers, we are able to plan specific facilities to match the need. In the past, attempts to buy land or build facilities ahead of time have proved unfruitful or even detrimental.
