Personalized learning is achieved through standards-based, rigorous and relevant curriculum that is aligned to digital tools and resources.

Course Description: (from COSG)

In this course, students will review and expand the grammar and vocabulary of the previous levels of study. Emphasis continues to be on free expression, both oral and written, through projects and presentations. Reading will include authentic short stories, notes, messages, newspaper and magazine articles, and will serve to reinforce basic concepts and knowledge about the Chinese culture. The students will learn how to understand and sustain more complex conversation, to write in Mandarin with coherence and correct grammatical application, and to develop a basic understanding and appreciation for Chinese literature. The curriculum is focused on listening, speaking, reading and writing at the intermediate/pre-advanced ACTFL proficiency level.

Enduring Understandings

- Paper-making (造図: zàozhǐ), the compass (指南図: zhǐnánzhēn), gunpowder (火図: huǒyào)
- There are several different kinds of traditional Chinese markets where you can shop, play games, eat, drink and have fun
- Rather than using the phrases 你多大? (nǐ duō dà) or 你几⊠? (nǐ jǐ suì), you can also find out someone's age by asking for someone's Chinese Zodiac sign
- The most important holiday of the Chinese calendar is Chinese New Year
- As with all cultures, China has its own creation myths
- Chinese culture has a deep-seated reverence for nature
- Traditional Chinese Medicine is an ancient medicinal practice that is still used today as an alternative to Western medicine

- "Nutritional therapy" (食疗: shíliáo), also known as "food therapy," is a medicinal branch of Traditional Chinese Medicine where what you eat is a big part of treating illness
- Peking Opera (京図: jīngù) is a traditional genre of stage performance involving singing, spectacular costumes, dramatic stories, and thrilling martial arts
- Confucianism (儒家: Rújiā), Daoism (道家: Dàojiā), and Buddhism (佛教: Fójiào), are three of the most important religious and social philosophies in China
- There are many interesting historical sites in China. Among them, the Terracotta Warriors (兵図 俑: Bīngmǎyŏng) and the Great Wall (図城: Chángchéng) are often listed among the top wonders of the world
