

# UNIFORM DRESS CODE



The following Dress Code is being implemented in support of our continued commitment to high standards.

## UNIFORM LISTS

### **Autumn (First half)**

Boys will wear full uniform, including ties.

Girls can choose to wear summer dresses or winter uniform, depending on the weather.

### **Autumn Term (Second half)**

Winter uniform is to be worn by all pupils.

### **Spring Term**

Winter uniform is to be worn by all pupils.

### **Summer Term**

Summer uniform is to be worn by all pupils.

Boys will wear full uniform, including ties, unless the Headmaster permits open collars on hot days.

## UNIFORM REQUIREMENTS

- Pupils are to wear blazers when they arrive and leave school every day. An exception may be made in the event of hot weather in the summer term, and this will be announced by the Headmaster.
- Hoodies are not permitted around school and are not to be worn in place of a jumper and or blazer.
- Trainers, including black trainer-style shoes, are not permitted around school. Trainers will be left in the 'shoe room' and worn only at break times.
- Hair must be off the face at all times and long hair (below the collar), must be tied back with a plain navy or black hair-tie. Hair must be neat in appearance and must not appear to be attention seeking. Bleaches or dyes that are in blatant contrast to a pupil's natural hair colour are not permitted.
- No make up, nail polish, acrylic nails or body adornments are permitted.

- No jewellery is permitted, with the exception of one pair of stud earrings which may be required to be removed for sport. Pupils may wear a religious symbol worn on a simple chain and kept inside clothing.

### **BOARDING HOUSE DRESS-CODE**

Home clothes can reflect individual personalities but must be appropriate to the school environment. Outfits should allow for movement and comfort and maintain age-appropriate modesty (e.g. no high-cut shorts and no tops which allow a bare midriff).

### **NON-UNIFORM DRESS CODE FOR SCHOOL TRIPS**

Home clothes, when permitted on day and residential trips, must be appropriate to the environment and purpose of the trip. Outfits should allow for movement and comfort and maintain age-appropriate modesty (e.g. no high-cut shorts and no tops which allow a bare midriff).
