Crew At Launch

"As an EL school, school culture is planned for, developed, and sustained through practices that bring the community together, promote shared understandings, and encourage all community members to become crew, not passengers. The structure of crew allows for relationship building, academic progress monitoring, and character development. Crew allows students to build positive connections with their peers and with their crew leader. Crew leaders strategically plan crew to address and assess these multiple goals." - Core Practice 27

The Goals of Crew

- RELATIONSHIPS Build strong, positive relationships between crew advisors and students where all students are well known and well supported through advocacy and accountability.
- BELONGING Build a sense of community, belonging, and positive engagement at Launch.
- CHARACTER Building Character by supporting students in becoming ethical people who contribute to their community and build a better world.
- ACADEMICS Supporting students in becoming effective learners, through progress and report card reflection, SLC/Passages and Academic Goal Setting.

Crews meet 3 times a week. Our objective is to be able to provide strong, individualized support to our students by ensuring that they are all well known by at least one person – their crew advisor.
