

COVID19 in the TIS Community Updates:

TIS will continue to follow the safety protocol that aims to reduce the risk of infections and transmissions of COVID19 at TIS and provide a work towards provide a safe learning environment. We will continue to monitor the situation in Tirana as well as our school and aim to provide a healthy and safe campus. In order to ensure all in the community are informed of any cases that may be impacting the school, TIS will plan to share any week updates to the COVID19 impacting the TIS community as well as school data.

Students: For the week of September 13th to September 17th: TIS was informed of two students that were confirmed positive of COVID19. The TIS COVID response team worked to track and trace both cases to confirm and define all staff and students that are defined as first level contacts.

TIS had confirmed student in the 7YO class on Tuesday, September 14. TIS had a confirmed student in the 10YO class on Friday, September 15. Thank you to the family of the 7YO student for keeping their child home on Monday and Tuesday. Due to the student staying home, there was no direct contact with any other students or staff at TIS. The 10YO sibling of the 7YO student was tested on Wednesday, September 15 and was confirmed positive. Due the the confirmed first level contact of the 10YO student, there were 19 student first level contacts and 4 TIS staff. We will continue to monitor the health of all 1st Level contact students and at this time we have no confirmed transmissions.

Staff: We have NO confirmed positive staff members that are currently being isolated.

Dear Parents of Elementary Students,

Weekend greetings to everyone!



We begin our NWEA MAP assessments this coming week and teachers are sharing their individual class schedules with you. In the fall, this is an assessment for 6-10yo elementary students. 6 and 7yo students will be testing in reading and math, and the other ages in reading, language usage, and math. There is nothing for students to do to prepare for these assessments – just get plenty of rest, eat a good breakfast, and do their best. MAP provides another data point, a snapshot in time, of your child's progress. There are many data points that teachers use to understand the abilities and the support needs of students. The results inform teachers of student strengths and areas to support them further in their education.

We thank all parents for helping to support the students who have been out due to COVID-19 impacts. Blended learning and distance learning is no easy task for anyone, so we are grateful for your support as well. We are fortunate to build on our experience from the past year and look forward to dates when affected students and teachers return to campus. The good news is that learning does continue regardless. As a reminder, our blended learning protocols can be found in past weeks' newsletters and the TIS Operating Handbook 2021-22.

This week, I enjoyed sharing a short story with individual 7 and 8yo classes, as well as students in Intensive English. It was a lot of fun to discuss the story with them in order to understand the author's purpose and to see what message can be taken from the story. I look forward to sharing in such a time with the other age levels in the future.

Middle School/Secondary News #fromthedeskofMrTempel

Dear Middle School/Secondary Parents and Families,

Great news! Nearly all Middle School and Secondary students are back in the building as of Tuesday of this week! It was so great to see so many faces back on campus!

A few health-related things to keep in mind:

- We have had some sickness going around the Middle School recently. Many students have taken COVID tests and they have come up negative which is great news! However, we still ask that you take caution with any type of illnesses in your home.
- If a student is sick, please do not send them to school until symptoms have been gone for 24 hours.
- If you suspect COVID, please get them tested.
- Keep in communication with school regarding symptoms, test results, and spreading amongst members of the household.
- Thank you to all of the parents/families that have emailed us frequently in regards to illnesses at home.

It takes all of us to continue to keep our students as safe and healthy as possible! Thank you for your continued support!

Below are the protocols we continue to keep in place in regards to Blended Learning. I have also kept the Mask Protocols in the newsletter as we are still having to remind many students to wear their masks over their mouth and nose. The addition of air purifiers in most of our classrooms is a welcome addition to our school environment, but we still need students to be mindful of covering their mouth and nose to minimize spread of viruses and illness.

Blended Learning Protocols 2021-2022 School Year

Covid Related Reasons in Which Blended Learning Will be Supported

- Student contracted Covid
- The students is defined as a 1st Level Contact by TIS
- If in the process of determining if a student is at-risk
- Student has been asked by school to remain home.

If a student is absent due to Covid-related reasons, they will be supported with a blended learning option beginning 24 hours after communicating the information to the school.

Student Absences for Non – COVID19 Reasons – Blended Learning Will Not Be the Expectation

- Sicknesses and Injury (non-Covid)
- Family trips/vacations
- Personal/ Family Appointments off Campus
- · Other non-Covid reasons for absence

Blended Learning Protocols for All Students/ Ages

- Approved blended learning will begin after a 24-hour time period to allow staff sufficient time to plan and prepare.
- Students are expected to follow the provided schedule and follow-through with diligent effort.
- Parents are expected to support students, as needed.
- Students are expected to attend online for the duration of the schedule provided to them.

Additional Blended Learning Protocols for Middle School/Secondary (11yo through Secondary IV)


- Students who qualify for blended learning will be expected to attend each class synchronously unless otherwise directed by the teacher.
- Any parents requesting blended learning for their students must fill out the Blended Learning
 Form. This will be provided to parents each week in the TIS Newsletter. Students not
 approved through this process but have a COVID-related absence during the school week
 must provide COVID-related documentation as soon as it is available. Upon approval,
 students should expect to join blended learning within 24 hours.
- This process is extremely important as teachers are not able to provide the support needed without sufficient time to prepare.

The mask protocol has not changed this year. I have noticed all students have masks, but some still need many reminders to where the masks correctly covering their mouth and nose. Please help support this as COVID is still a great concern and we want to keep ALL TIS students and families safe and healthy!

Reminders of Expectations for Students



As we now have completed three full weeks of school, I sent an email to students reminding them of the daily expectations we have for all of our Middle School and Secondary students. Below is the email I sent, so you know what has been communicated to them:



To All MS and Secondary Students

Important Reminders

- 1. Phones Now that you have locks on your lockers, there are no more warnings. Phones will be taken if phones are out without permission.
 - If there is an emergency and you NEED to use your phone, come to my office and you can take care of what you need there.
- 2. Locks Yay locks! Just remember, as with your locker, these are your responsibility. Do not give your combination to others and keep your lock LOCKED on your locker!
- 3. Breaks/Lunch -
 - Please ONLY hang out in designated/supervised areas during lunch/lunch recess.
 - Phones are NOT allowed to be out during lunch. (They should be locked up in your locker.)
 - Secondary students eat in the cafeteria during Secondary lunch.
 - Middle School student eat in the cafeteria during Middle School lunch.
 - Anyone can eat outside during either lunch. If you take trays/plates/utensils/cups from the cafeteria, you must bring them back when you are finished.
 - CLEAN UP AFTER YOURSELF!
 - If there is an Elementary class having PE in the gym, STAY OFF THE GYM FLOOR. Please go around another way.
 - When eating in the cafeteria, your mask should be worn at all times unless you are eating.
- 4. English Only Policy It seems many of you are still having difficulty remembering to speak English while in class, the hallways, and other common areas at school. This policy has not changed and ALL students are expected to speak the one common language, English.
- 5. Tardies I have noticed more and more students taking their time getting to class. There is no reason you should not be able to make it to class on time. We are now in WEEK 3, so teachers will be counting you tardy if you are late. Don't be surprised if there are some "tardy sweeps" in the near future.
- 6. Coffee/Snacks/Food in the Classroom -
 - There is NO food or drink in the classroom.
 - You are to finish your coffee and snacks in the cafeteria before you leave.
 - Students will not be allowed to take their coffee/hot chocolate/snacks out of the cafeteria during break.
 - If you are late to class because you had to stay and finish your coffee and/or snack, you will be counted tardy.

7. Masks -

- All students will wear masks over their mouth and nose at all times unless:
 - They are eating outside or in the cafeteria.
 - They are drinking outside or in the cafeteria.
 - They are outside and distanced from their peers.
- Masks should not come off to take drinks in the hallway or other common areas.

ALL things in this email are extremely important. Please adhere to all the expectations listed above as well as other common expectations not listed.











MAP Testing Begins THIS WEEK!

The time has arrived for all of our Middle School, Secondary I and Secondary II students to take the MAP test! This will give us valuable data regarding where are students are and how are teachers can best teach our students and help them find success.

Students will be testing in the subject area class as follows: Writing Class – Language Usage test Literature Class – Reading test Math, Algebra I – Math test

13-year-old science Life Science

In the first unit of 13-year-old science (life science), students learned how to use a microscope and practiced by viewing potato cells and onion skin cells. They learned that different stains helped them to see different parts of the cell. The cell walls in the long, rectangular onion skin cells were very apparent using a blue dye (methylene blue) while the nucleus of the cell was visible with a different stain. Large starch-containing granules were numerous in the irregularly shaped potato cells. The challenge was to use their cell phones (with permission, of course) to photograph the microscope slides they had prepared through the eyepiece of the microscope.

NOTIFICATIONS FROM THE SCHOOL

TIS feels that it is important to be as transparent as possible with families concerning suspected and confirmed cases. However, we also feel it is important to keep specifics confidential. Parents will be notified that a student with their child's class/cohort has tested positive. The school will also remind and notify parents of the step-by-step procedures to follow. TIS administration and teachers will keep in close contact with the family throughout the entire process.

COVID positive

The school will only inform parents before a positive test is reported if there is a high level of evidence or concern that it might be COVID.

HOUSEHOLD CONTACTS

First level contacts within the household must self isolate for 10 days. If symptoms begin to show among other family members, the 10 days should be extended.

STUDENT / EMPLOYEE FIRST LEVEL CONTACTS

The TIS COVID response team will help to determine first level contacts at TIS, close any necessary classes and inform first level contacts.

All 1st level contacts must self-isolate for 10 days.

All Household 2nd Level Contacts are asked to monitor and stay home for 7 days if the 1st level contact is showing symptoms.
