

Find out the different things your child likes to spend time on online. The online world is full of lots of great resources and you should try to make sure your child is making the most of them all!

Understanding what your child likes to do online is a good first step in helping them manage how they spend time on their favourite device. There's no set amount of time your child should or shouldn't spend online and it's important to do what's right for your family. Remember not every online activity is the same and children can still experience risks even when online for a short time.

It's best to start any conversation about keeping safe online with the positives. So why not start by exploring what your child likes to do and which are their favourite apps and games. Making sure your child is doing a range of different activities online will help them develop new skills and good online habits as they get older.

Please note the upgrade to the gas network in Harley Shute Road started on the

The Malagiri school, Nepal has reopened

WSLPA has a link with the Malagiri school in Nepal to benefit pupils in both these communities. The Malagiri school was set up by the University of Brighton's School of Education, in 2011, to fund a school for children aged three to eight in a remote area of Nepal. It now educates around 60 children in brightly coloured and well-resourced classrooms. Many people in Malagiri live in conditions of extreme poverty. Their homes are extremely basic, constructed of rough-hewn wood with no glazing in the windows and there is no electricity supply. The villagers grow crops and keep animals, selling any excess produce to buy essentials such as clothing, winter supplies and medicine. 


Recommended Read (KS1)

The Milly-Molly-Mandy Storybook I Author: Joyce Lankester Brisley


Milly-Molly-Mandy lives with her mother, father, uncle, aunt, grandmother and grandfather in a 'nice white cottage with a thatched roof'. In each of these twenty-one stories, she sets off on an adventure, sometimes with the help of 'little-friend-Susan' or neighbour Billy Blunt.

First published in 1925, Milly-Molly-Mandy's stories now have a nostalgic charm that will appeal to parents and grandparents who will remember them from their own childhood. However, these gentle stories of activities such as giving a party or setting out on a picnic, told in simple and direct language, still offer much to attract today's young readers.




Blast Off PE Home Learning

Can you encourage your partner even if they make a mistake?


Time to Learn:
