THE SCHOOL

The Meadows School is an independent, coeducational, college preparatory day school serving grades PK-12. Upper School (grades 9 through 12) enrolls 258 students, Middle School (grades 6, 7, and 8) enrolls 184 students, Lower School (grades K through 5) enrolls 359 students, and PK enrolls 95 students. There are 41 students in the class of 2022.

Founded in 1984, The Meadows School is accredited by the Northwest Association of Independent Schools (NWAIS) and the Northwest Accreditation Commission (NWAC).

The Meadows School fosters in its students a love of, and respect for, learning-inspiring them to seek knowledge independently and preparing them for higher academic pursuits. The School helps students achieve positive values and nurtures character development in an academically rigorous environment that upholds the highest moral and ethical standards.

COVID-19

Students pivoted to remote learning on 3/18/2020 following our closure due to COVID-19. Classes met online using a synchronous schedule. For 2019-2020, 2nd semester, we weighted 3rd and 4th quarters at 50/50. For 2020-2021, students attended primarily in-person. Distance learning was available if requested. Normal letter grading was consistent regardless of instructional method.

FINANCIAL AID

The Meadows School seeks to attract able and ambitious students of varied socio-economic backgrounds. This year, \$3,188,350 in aid was awarded to 19.5% of the student body.

ADVANCED PLACEMENT & ADVANCED TOPICS COURSES

Students have the opportunity to challenge themselves through our Advanced Placement (AP) and Advanced Topics (AT) courses. Given the challenging nature of The Meadows School's curriculum, students are not permitted to take more than four AP courses. In May 2021, 133 students wrote 286 examinations; 60% of the scores were 4's and 5's; and 88% were 3's or better. AT courses are taught at the college level and are research and project based.

GRADING AND CLASS RANK

Grade Point Average (GPA) is calculated using all courses with the exception of Physical Education (PE) and courses taken as pass/fail. The GPA is cumulative from the fall semester of freshman year. Plus and minus grades are reflected (e.g. B+=3.3, B-=2.7). Students receive an extra .02 of credit for each Honors course per semester and an extra .03 of credit for each AP and AT course per semester. Students are not ranked.

DISCIPLINARY REPORTING POLICY

Service to one's community, character, and scholarship are pillars of The Meadows School's mission and core values. The School maintains, and benefits from, a relationship with colleges and universities built upon these same principles. In order to foster transparency and trust, and in keeping with the highest ethical principles and NACAC's Statement of Good Practice, college counselors will disclose whether a student has been suspended or expelled.

COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT

The Meadows School Community Engagement program is designed to give students an opportunity to acquire a greater sense of self and community. Students must complete the 126 hour requirement over four years. Eighty percent of these hours must be completed off campus.

The Meadows School is a member of Global Online Academy (GOA), a consortium of the world's leading independent schools whose mission is to translate into online classrooms the intellectually rigorous programs and excellent teaching that are hallmarks of its member schools.
