Some geographical skills and topics overlap with other subjects, therefore providing mutual support, for example:

- · Ecosystems and Ecology with biology
- Statistical work with maths
- · Research skills with history
- · Resources, Meteorology, Natural Hazards, and hypothesis testing with science
- Economic themes with business
- · Diagrammatic and presentation skills with art
- · Essay writing skills with English
- · Terminology, and knowledge and understanding of other countries with languages


Geography allows the science specialist to develop important literacy skills, as well as benefiting from an overlap in academic content. It allows the arts specialist to develop logical thought processes and an enquiring mind. Geography as a main subject avoids the problems of over-specialisation, which can result from a poor combination of A Level subjects.

LIFE AFTER A LEVEL GEOGRAPHY

Geography can provide a pupil with:

- · A high A Level grade (including A*)
- · A broad knowledge and understanding of patterns and processes in the modern world
- · Research skills and logical thought processes
- The ability to present information in a logical and coherent manner, in a variety of ways.

Geography graduates become some of the most sought-after by employers. They are less likely to be unemployed and are likely to earn above average starting salaries compared with those studying other subjects.

FIELDWORK

This is an essential part of geography, a window into the real world of our

amazing subject. As part of our new specification we take our students on a six-day residential field trip to the dynamic coastal environment of North Devon, giving them the opportunity to independently investigate an issue of their choice, as well as offering geographical enrichment. We also travel more locally to Southwold and investigate the fluvial environments on our own doorstep!

There is also an optional nine day trip to Iceland to study Natural Hazards. For many pupils the fieldwork is a highlight of their A Level studies.

All the fieldwork is closely matched to the specification and designed to provide all the information needed for the A Level. Parents and pupils should be aware that there is a cost involved with fieldwork.
