FDLRS EMERALD COAST PROUDLY SERVES EDUCATORS, ADMINISTRATORS, AGENCIES, SUPPORT PERSONNEL AND FAMILIES OF STUDENTS WITH DISABILITIES IN **ESCAMBIA, OKALOOSA AND SANTA ROSA** SCHOOL DISTRICTS.

The **Florida Diagnostic & Learning Resources System (FDLRS)** provides diagnostic, instructional and technology support services to district exceptional education programs and families of students with disabilities. Service centers include 19 centers that directly serve school districts in the areas of Child Find, Parent Services, Human Resource Development (HRD) and Technology.

4 FDLRS FUNCTIONS:

CHILD FIND: FDLRS Child Find, in coordination with school districts, locates children who are potentially eligible for services under the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA) and links them with needed services. Child Find services help to promote general public awareness of programs and services available for young children who have, or who are at risk of developing disabilities. Service coordination for diagnostic screening, placement, training and support is also provided.

PARENT SERVICES: FDLRS Parent Services provides information, parent workshops and support to districts and families in order to promote effective parent participation in the education of children who are exceptional and/or have special needs. Parent services include assistance in the development of family-friendly programs, training and support for services for children with disabilities and the

support of partnerships between schools and parents to enhance student achievement.

HUMAN RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT: FDLRS Human Resource Development (HRD) personnel provide professional learning opportunities for educators focused on refining teacher practice and increasing student achievement. Professional learning events are aligned to Florida's Professional Development System Evaluation Protocol. FDLRS HRD Specialists support educators in their study of effective learning and teaching practices by providing needs assessments, multi-faceted workshops, facilitation of local learning



communities, implementation and coaching sessions and follow-up support. The professional learning activities are offered in face-to-face and virtual settings. They feature a variety of training levels including awareness, in-depth, skill development and implementation.

TECHNOLOGY: FDLRS Technology Function provides assistance and support in the appropriate use of a variety of technologies for students, teachers, professional staff and parents. Support services are available in the areas of assistive technology, instructional technology, Universal Design for Learning (UDL), Accessible Instructional Materials (AIM)/National Instructional Materials Accessibility Standard (NIMAS) Florida services, and virtual/online instruction. The Technology Specialists at the 19 local FDLRS Associate Centers also collaborate with the Technology & Learning Connections (TLC) Team, Regional Technology Coordinators and district-based Local Assistive Technology Specialists (LATS).

FDLRS Emerald Coast has offered training, in partnership with districts and other discretionary projects, focused on assisting parents to facilitate their child's education. Training was provided on Understanding the World of ESE, Understanding the IEP, Understanding 504, Understanding the MTSS Process, What is FDLRS and How Can We Help, Surrogate Parent, and on various technology supports, including Snap and Read and subscriptions to LRP's Special Ed Connection. A renewed partnership with the Exceptional Family Member Program on Eglin Air Force Base has provided additional opportunities for support collaboration. Coordinated through the FDLRS Network, the PDA Program is available free of charge to all Florida educators. Many of these courses **support the new recertification requirements** when appropriately coded under Exceptional Student Education in local Professional Learning Catalogue (PLC).

Various trainings for paraprofessionals and administrators were developed and provided per district requests. Inclusive Scheduling training was conducted at

Rhodes Elementary in Santa Rosa County. BPIE and PIE training and facilitation was provided at both the county and school level in all districts. Schools with newly conducted BPIE self-assessments include Ferry Pass Middle, Myrtle Grove Elementary, Holm Elementary, Byrneville Elementary, Escambia Westgate, Ferry Pass Elementary, Brentwood Elementary, Beulah Elementary, Bratt Elementary, Weis Elementary in Escambia County; SS Dixon Primary, Chumuckla Elementary, Navarre High, Gulf Breeze Elementary, and Gulf Breeze Middle in Santa Rosa County; and STEMM Academy and Bluewater Elementary in Okaloosa County.

FDLRS TECHNOLOGY SUPPORTS

Twenty-nine trainings were provided to support universal design for learning, differentiating instruction, pre-K supports, and learning strategies. Support for MELD continued. Meetings/trainings with local assistive technology specialists focused on problem-solving for students with significant cognitive disabilities and the use of assistive/augmentative communication devices. The use of Snap&Read, Bookshare, and Learning Ally was again expanded. The center website transition to FinalSite was completed and Facebook/Twitter social media accounts were managed, assuring clear communication with all stakeholders.
