

The Big Picture with Fr. Bob



Dear Friends,

This Friday, we will be celebrating St. Therese of Lisieux's feast day. I remember listening to a Catholic radio station and they were discussing St. Therese's spirituality. She said that she wanted to love God as He had never been loved before. Does that sound a little ambitious? I'm sure she wasn't the first saint to have such

aspirations. If St. Therese meant she wanted to be the greatest lover of God ever, well, I don't think I could ever hope to follow too close in her footsteps. I know I fall short far too often.

However, there is another way of interpreting her goal. I'm sure St. Therese was keenly aware that each person is called to make a unique response to God's countless invitations throughout one's life. In that light, we are all called to love God as He has never been loved before.

Sometimes when thinking of what gift to give someone for their birthday, we come across a card or a gift entitled "For the man (or woman) who has everything." Well, we may feel that way about God. What can we give God that He doesn't already have? The answer is simple. The only thing God does not have is our love. That needs to be a free will offering.

The truth of the matter is that every time we are generous, forgiving, thoughtful to another person, we are loving God as He has never been loved before.

Each day provides us with new opportunities to love God. If we neglect those opportunities day after day, then something very important within us starts to stagnate and perhaps even die. If we strive to love God, we continue to grow spiritually and emotionally.

We read in Psalm 118:24 "This is the day the Lord has made; we will rejoice and be glad in it." Let us take the gift of this day and indeed love God as He has never been loved before. What a profound difference it will make in our life and in a rippling effect, what a profound difference it will make in our world.

This weekend, we celebrate Priesthood Sunday. I am so grateful that I have the opportunity to serve and love God as a priest!

There is a peace that comes to us whenever we say "yes" to God's plan for our life. No matter how clear we may feel God is directing us, it is always appreciated when we receive encouragement from others. Thank you all for providing so much encouragement to Fr. David, Fr. John, and myself!

God has a beautiful plan for each of us. It is never without its share of pain and sorrow, but still our life will be beautiful if we say "yes" to the Lord. Let us pray for one another that we may answer generously and humbly, the Call to follow Jesus, wherever He leads us. May we love Him as He has never been loved before!

On this Priesthood Sunday, let us pray that many men answer the Call to follow Jesus, serving and loving God's people as priests.



DIVINE CHILD RELIC OF THE WEEK St. Vincent de Paul Feast Day ~ September 27

Divine Child has 43 Relics in our Eucharistic Adoration Chapel and St. Vincent de Paul is one of them! You may view a list of DC's relics located on the bookshelf in the chapel. Patron of charities; horses; hospitals; leprosy; lost articles; prisoners; spiritual help; Saint Vincent de Paul Societies; Vincentian Service Corps; volunteers

St. Vincent de Paul was born to a poor peasant family in the French village of Pouy on April 24, 1581. His first formal education was provided by the Franciscans.

He was ordained in 1600 and in 1605 while on a ship, was captured, brought to Tunis and sold as a slave. Two years later, he and his master managed to escape and both returned to France. St. Vincent went to Avignon and later to Rome to continue his studies. While there, he became a chaplain to the Count of Goigny and was placed in charge of distributing money to the deserving poor.

From that point forward, he spent his life preaching missions to and providing relief to the poor. He established hospitals for them and later extended his concern and ministry to convicts. The need to evangelize and assist these souls was so great and the demands beyond his own ability to meet that he founded the Ladies of Charity, a lay institute of women, to help, as well as a religious institute of priests - the Congregation of Priests of the Mission, commonly referred to now as the Vincentians.



Anointing of the Sick

Please call the Rectory Office to request this Sacrament. In emergency situations when the office is closed, the emergency line attendant will take the call.

Baptisms

Arrangements must be made in advance and parents must attend a **Baptism class** prior to the Baptism. The Church requires that at least one of the parents and one of the godparents/sponsors be practicing Catholics; that is, they attend Mass each weekend.

Marriages

One person of the couple must be an active, registered parishioner of Divine Child for <u>at least 6 months</u>. (*Exceptions are made for DC alumni*.) The Church requires a <u>minimum of 6 months</u> for marriage preparation. <u>Potential wedding date is not confirmed until couple meets with a</u> <u>Divine Child priest</u>. The celebrant will be a Divine Child priest unless the couple has someone close to them who is a Catholic priest. Music for the liturgy must be coordinated with our Director of Music Ministry, Mr. Matthew Simpson.

Funerals

Arrangements are made in conjunction with the funeral home. Eulogies must be given at the funeral home or at the funeral luncheon; no eulogies at the funeral Mass, please. *Memorial Masses* are scheduled Monday-Friday <u>only</u>.

Arrangements must be made in advance at the Rectory Office. Please call Alicia Reyes at 313-277-3110.
