Graduation from KHS with diploma	A-G's Requirements for CSU/ UC
3 years of History/Social Science	2 years of History/Social Science
4 years of English	4 years of English
2 years of Math (must pass a year of Algebra)	3 years of Math (up to Algebra 2) Recommend 4 years
3 years of Science (must include Biology, Chemistry & Physics)	2 years of Science (Life & Physical) Recommend 3 years
1 year of World Language or 1 year of Fine Art	2 years of World Language Recommend 3 years & 1 year of Fine Art
2 years of PE & 70 Elective Credits	1 year of College Prep Elective

GRADUATION STATUS

- Senior Letters and Transcripts have been mailed home in order to inform parents of student's graduation status.
- Review Senior Letter and Transcript.
- Look at it carefully. Determine if you are on track to graduate.
- Courses "In Progress" are listed for senior year.
- On track seniors should have at least **160 credits** completed as of right now! **If not, check with your counselor of options (AB 104)**
- Total credits needed to graduate is **220 credits**.
- You must have **190 credits** by the end of 1st semester in order to participate in Senior Activities.

- Applications
 - CSU: Opens Oct. 1 & Closes Nov. 30
 - UC: Opens Aug. 1 & Closes Nov. 30
- Check on-track status & launch CSU/UC Applications from your [CaliforniaColleges.edu](https://www.californiacolleges.edu) account
- SAT or ACT – Currently Not Required



CA PRIVATE/INDEPENDENT COLLEGES & UNIVERSITIES

To apply for admission, go to the [Common Application](#).

- Be sure to check individual college websites for specific requirements.
- A-G required courses must be completed with grades of C or better!
- SAT or ACT (likely suspended for most campuses)
- Personal Essay
- Letter(s) of recommendation



COLLEGE ATHLETICS

The NAIA (National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics) is the governing body of small athletic programs throughout the United States.

Register with the NAIA Eligibility Center*

1. Visit www.playnaia.org to check out schools and to register.
2. Create a Student-Athlete Profile.
3. Be sure to read all instructions regarding how to submit transcripts and required documents.

The NCAA (National Collegiate Athletic Association) works with you and your high school to help you prepare for life as a student-athlete.

Register with the NCAA Eligibility Center*

1. Visit www.eligibilitycenter.org and enter as a college-bound student-athlete.
2. Create a student account.
3. On the About Me page, enter some quick facts, including your name, address, date of birth and gender.

► GOOD CHOICE for AA or AS (Associate of Arts/Science) degree, vocational certification or to complete general education coursework for university transfer.

Requirement to attend: HS Diploma or 18 years old

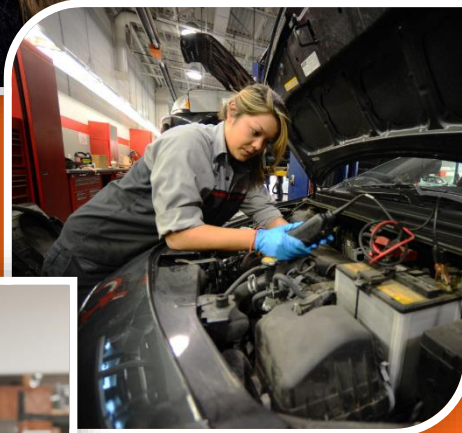
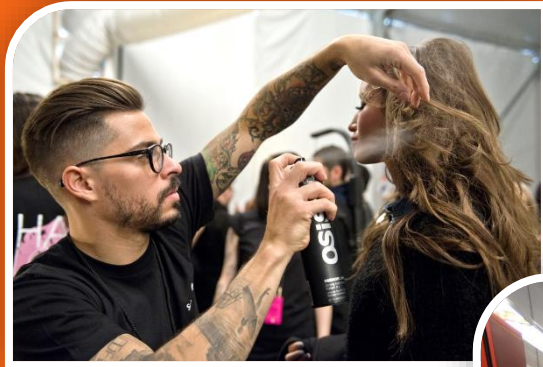

TRADE SCHOOL/TECHNICAL COLLEGE



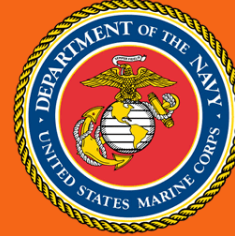
What are they?

Grants are usually based on financial need and don't have to be repaid.

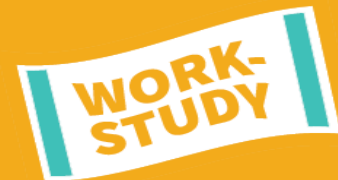
2
