

Parent Engagement Results & Efforts to Improve

42%- I feel my opinions are taken into consideration regarding policy decisions. (This score has declined over the last few years: 100, 97, 65, and 42).

We are committed to being the best elementary school possible. We are committed to every child and know that our parents/guardians are their child's first and most important teacher. Keeping this in mind, we are always interested in receiving feedback from our families regarding the operations of our school. While we may not always be able to implement your suggestions, we do always take them into consideration and share them with those in a position to affect policy decisions.

Our school board sets policies which we are required to follow. That is NOT to say that we don't have a voice in how our school operates and the experiences your child enjoys while at Rib. It just means that like any organization, there are parameters from which we must operate.

We have been talking a lot about things within our *circle of influence* during this pandemic. Making sure to provide input and feedback regarding areas that we can influence is important.

One area I can think of where this is critically important is when there is a *disciplinary matter at school*. Parents are often called and asked to join the conversation regarding what course of action is most appropriate. You know your child best, and if our goal is to make everything a learning experience, then we need parents and caregivers to assist in this decision-making process to arrive at the best outcome. Sometimes we have to agree to disagree, and sometimes we just have to compromise. Regardless, your voice is important and is always taken into consideration.

A second area where you are part of the *circle of influence* is through P.T.O. Whether you attend meetings or not, you are a part of the PTO and your voice is important. Some parents participate by signing up to volunteer. Some participate by organizing an event or attending an event with their family. Some parents share ideas and input through a friend or by sending an email message to the school or to a P.T.O. officer. Your voice is instrumental in making decisions about what we provide for our school.

A third area where parents have *direct influence* is when making requests about your child's learning needs or learning style or even which teacher you believe would be a better fit. Again, while we cannot honor all requests, we DO make an honest effort to weigh your feedback and take it into consideration. Together, we make better decisions.

Our score in this area has plummeted over the last four years. I wonder if the pandemic is the culprit or if there are other factors at play. What I can say is that we will continue to ask your opinion about operational practices at Rib. We will continue to survey you to gather your feedback (like we did at open house) and we will continue to pour over your feedback through our GT parent survey and the Parent School Perceptions Survey.

If only 42% of you believe your opinions are taken into consideration, that's not ok. That's not what we want and we will continue to look for ways to improve. While we are bound by school district policies and what they expect, we do have an awful lot of latitude in other areas and a few of those examples were listed.

Please continue to share your feedback and input with us. Please continue to give us the benefit of the doubt when we are unable to change a decision, but also help us to see areas where we can grow and improve. Together, we are better!

We hope to see all families at the Family Fun Festival. Our students are working so hard at being wonderful leaders. You will be amazed at their skills! Can't wait to see you!





practice being proactive about the things that are in your Circle of Control and working to improve those things. The more time you spend in your circle of control, the more improvement you will see.



COVID Information

Students must stay home from school if they have the following symptoms.

- If a student has symptoms, it is recommended that they immediately be tested for COVID, regardless of vaccine status.
- The student may return to school with proof of a negative PCR COVID test or an alternate diagnosis from a medical practitioner.
- If parents choose not to have their child tested, the student is presumed positive and must stay home for 10 days, be fever-free for 24 hours without fever-reducing medication, and have improvement of symptoms before returning to school.
- If a student or anyone else living in the home tests positive, all students in the home (unless vaccinated and not showing symptoms) must quarantine for the 10 days of the positive person's isolation PLUS an additional 10 days quarantine, a total of 20 days. If the positive person can isolate away from the students, the other students in the home must quarantine for 10 days from the last contact with the positive person.
- Parents are asked to notify the school if a student later develops symptoms or tests positive for COVID.
- If your child is identified as a close contact to someone outside the home, follow the directions from the health department.

2021-2022 Wausau West Traveling Basketball

Wausau West Boys Basketball offers competitive traveling teams for boys in grades 3rd - 8th Grade. It is the goal of the Wausau West Boys Basketball program to create a fun and positive learning experience for our youth basketball players while still building players fundamental skills and developing a competitive mindset.

We are changing how we handle our Traveling Team Basketball Uniform situation. You will be purchasing your son's uniform and it is for them to keep and reuse throughout their years of playing Traveling Basketball. We highly suggest that you order the uniform a little bigger so that they get multiple years of use out of the uniform. Your uniform package that you will be purchasing includes a Jersey & Shorts along with a shooting shirt. Information and Pricing is listed below.

Season Length Fee - Financial assistance available if needed

3rd - 4th Grade: November - February \$125.00 (includes Uniform, shooting shirt, 5 Warrior Cards)

5th - 6th Grade: November - Early March \$150.00 (includes shooting shirt, 5 Warrior Cards)
7th - 8th Grade: January - March \$150.00 (includes shooting shirt, 5 Warrior Cards)

Family Discount:

1st child Cost = Price above which includes Shooting Shirt + Warrior cards
Per additional Child Cost = \$75 which includes Shooting Shirt

Program Structure

3rd - 4th Grade

- Team Split evenly and all players play in every game as evenly as possible
- Will play in 4 to 6 tournaments, with possible scrimmages throughout the season
- A select team will be formed after the last tournament is played, Select team will consist of 10 players who will be chosen by the Wausau West coaching staff. Select team will play in 1-2 additional tournaments.
- Season Runs from November February

5th - 6th Grade

- 5th grade will be split evenly and all players will play in every game, playing time will not always be equal.
- 6th grade team creation will be based on player skill level, if teams can be split evenly they will be. Playing time will not always be equal. Creation of teams will be decided by the Wausau West coaching Staff.
- Will play in 6 8 tournaments (around 20 games)
- Season runs November late February/Early March

7th - 8th Grade

- Teams will be divided based on Skill/Ability. Teams determined by Wausau West coaching staff.
- Will play in 6 8 tournaments (around 20 games)
- Season runs from November March.

<u>Practice Structure - Practice is mandatory</u>

- 3rd 5th grades will practice 2 times per week (Monday/Thursday or Tuesday/Thursday) 5:30-7:00 or 7:00-8:30


