# VOLLEYBALL GETS SWEEP AT MERCY POWER SERIES; BOYS SOCCER SHUTS OUT EVEREST

## IRISH GO 3-0 AT MERCY POWER SERIES

The Notre Dame Varsity Volleyball team went 3-0 at the Mercy Power Series, defeating Seaholm, Rochester, and Lake Orion in straight sets. The Irish began the day with a 25-21, 25-16 win over Seaholm. Leah Greif dished out 14 assists and had six points, including two aces. Aly Borellis also had 14 assists to go with five points, two aces and nine kills. Sophia Sudzina continued to be a force at the net at she led the Irish with 12 kills. Josie Bloom was solid on defense with nine digs and 14 serve receptions while Ally Berent had eight digs, five points and an ace. In the second game, Notre Dame defeated Rochester 25-12. 25-13. Greif finished with six points, three digs, and eight assists while Borellis had four kills, four digs, and 10 assists. Sara Nouhan chipped in with five kills while Sudzina had eight kills, three points, and two aces. Bloom had five points, including three aces, to go with nine digs while Berent had 13 points with eight aces. In the final match, the Irish led from startto-finish in a 25-11, 25-15 win over Lake Orion. Sudzina ended the day with eight more kills and three points, including two aces. Nouhan added four kills and Borellis matched those four kills and dished out 10 assists. Berent had 14 serve receptions, eight points and two aces while Bloom added eight points and four aces.

### IRISH GET SHUTOUT WIN OVER EVEREST

The Notre Dame Boys Varsity Soccer team picked up a 1-0 win over Everest. Anthony Zaleski scored the lone goal of the match with seven minutes remaining in the first half and Owen Thieme went the distance in goal to record the shutout.

### IRISH COMPETE AT HOLLY FESTIVAL OF RACES

The Notre Dame Girls and Boys Cross Country teams finished fifth and 11th, respectively, in their divisions at the Holly Festival of Races. The meet was comprised of more than 90 high schools competing in five separate divisions. The young Notre Dame team continued to improve posting 21 PRs (personal records) on the day. Zoe Hoke, Anna Hauck, Kate Stacey, Adri Lorenz all medaled for the girls by finishing in the top 25. Hoke was the top finisher (fourth overall) with a PR of 20:19, ranking her fourth in the region in her first year as a member of the Cross Country team. Stacey, who also set a PR, ran a 22:19 posting her best time in three years at the 5K distance. Erin Connelly rounded out the scoring for the varsity team. Loretta Alonso picked up a medal in the JV race with a 19th place finish in her first high school Cross Country 5K race. Wade Robinson and Ben Kinkade were the medal winners for the boys. Robinson finished fourth overall with a time of 16:56 and Kinkade finished 31st with a PR of 19:00 flat. A trio of freshmen, Sam Phillips, Chris Hunter and Ryan Wojichowski rounded out the varsity scoring, all setting PRs in the process. Felipe Sanchez medaled in the JV race with a 21st overall finish in his first race of the season.



# EARLY OFFENSE LEADS PIONEERS OVER IRISH

The Notre Dame Varsity Football team dropped a 38-30 decision to Harper Woods. After a scoreless opening quarter, the Pioneers jumped out to a 14-0 lead on a two yard rushing touchdown by Christion Stokes (West Virginia commit) and a 67 yard receiving touchdown from Tay'Shawn Trent (Michigan commit). The Irish would cut the deficit to 14-7 on the ensuing drive on a one yard Jacob Tuttle run, but Harper Woods would answer with a score right before the half to go up 22-6. Notre Dame would respond on the opening drive of the second half as Tuttle scored his second rushing touchdown of the game, this time from five yards out. However, Harper Woods would score on their next two drives to go up 38-14. The Irish fought back, getting an eight yard receiving touchdown by Bradon Prater and a 31 yard rushing score from Tuttle to close within 38-30 late in the game but the Pioneers would recover one final onside kick attempt to seal the win. Chris Galle and Alex Scherle both led the Notre Dame defense with seven tackles while Evan McGhee (six) and Evan Noga (five) also had strong games. Prater finished with 64 rushing yards and 42 receiving yards while Scherle led all Notre Dame receivers with 59 yards. Tuttle threw for 161 yards and a touchdown while adding 62 yards and three scores on the ground.
