


Grown-ups!

Emotional Bank Accounts

As part of Leader in Me, we discuss EBA's or Emotional Bank Account. Our emotional bank account is our self concept and feeling of belonging and acceptance. We work to find ways to make deposits or add to other people's emotional bank account through words and actions. (i.e. holding the door open for another person, telling someone they're important or valued, playing with a friend, eating lunch with someone). We try to avoid withdrawing or taking away from someone else's bank account (verbally putting another person down, excluding others, etc.).

Ways to practice this outside of school include can include a question like, "What is an emotional bank account?" "What does it sound like or look like to make a deposit into someone's account?" When siblings disagree and say something hurtful, how might you be able to help the kids navigate away from putting each other down and instead work to problem solve with words (be proactive).



Keep Students Safe!


An Author is Coming!



The Board of Education recently updated COVID mitigation practices for the school district. Please note that there are elementary guidelines and secondary guidelines. Elementary guidelines are based on the number of COVID cases in one classroom. At the secondary level, guidelines are based on percentage of COVID cases in the building over a seven day period. The charts below outline the actions that will be taken.
