Our fantastic Year 11 pupils were the first cohort to go through a three year GCSE programme, which had been designed to give them more time to explore subjects in greater depth and go beyond the confines of GCSE. Our young people, families and teachers all showed enormous resilience, patience and level-headedness as pupils progressed through their course without any certainties regarding how they would ultimately be assessed. We are thrilled with the standards our pupils reached and impressed by the personal qualities they displayed. Please read more about their achievements in these pages.

- The average result achieved by a BGS pupil at GCSE was once again a grade 7 (grade A).
- There were more show-stopping grade 9s (A**) than any • other grade - a grand total of 318 in all.
- Twenty-two pupils celebrated with a clean sweep of grades 9 and 8 (A^*/A^*) .
- Getting on for half of all results were grades 8 and 9 (A*-A**).
- More than a third of BGS pupils had a clean sweep of the • top grades, 7-9 (purely As and A*s).
- Overall, four in five grades were at grade 6 (B) and above.
- Nine 9s. Four pupils achieved the quite extraordinary feat of a full house of the very top grade 9 (A**) Many congratulations went to Ciya, Katie, Adam and Saifullah.




Quotes from the Head:

EXCELLENT GRADES IN AN UNUSUAL YEAR

Bury Grammar sixth formers celebrated stunning A Level results again in 2021, following 18 months of upheaval, remote learning, and a significant number of logistical and personal challenges overcome. As we all know, no-one was unaffected by the pandemic. We were immensely proud of every single one of our students for whom the average grade was once again an A, in line with previous generations'.

- The average grade at A Level at Bury Grammar School in 2021 was an A in line with previous generations.
- There was a 100% pass rate.
- 28.4% of grades awarded were A*s.
- More than four in ten sixth formers achieved the feat of straight As and A*s and well over half of all results, 57.2%, were grades A and A*.
- Over 80% of grades reached the 'gold standard' of A* to B.

GCSE grades overall were truly impressive, which made it extremely difficult to pick out just a few academic departments, but the following results were, in particular, worthy of note.

Stunning standards in STEM

 In the separate sciences, around nine in ten grades were grade 9-6 (A**-B): Biology 93%, Chemistry 86% and Physics 87%. This bode very well for a year group who were opting for A Level sciences in large numbers.

Mr Andy Watts, Head of the Science Faculty, said, "The outstanding results this year were testimony to the hard work of our amazing pupils and superb staff. Our pupils should be delighted with their results and we look forward to welcoming record numbers of them back into A Level sciences."

In Further Maths, the subject which sets our STEM pupils apart from others at GCSE, pupils enjoyed 87.5% grades at 9-6 (A**-B).

Mr Pete O'Sullivan, Head of the Mathematics Faculty, added, "We were delighted to see so many pupils achieving top grades in mathematics, reflecting the superb efforts that this year group had made during a uniquely challenging two-year period. There were many talented mathematicians going on to study Mathematics or Further Mathematics A Levels and we hope to see some of them aiming to emulate recent BGS Sixth Form Mathematics students who have gone on to study Mathematics or associated subjects at Oxford, Cambridge and other top universities. Well done, Year 11."

Amazing achievements in the Arts

- In Drama and Religious Studies, more than 90% grades were at 9-6 (A**-B); 90.5% in Drama and 90.9* in R.S.
- In English Language and English Literature, two subjects taken by every single pupil, 85.2% and 85.9% respectively of grades were 9-6 (A**-B), setting pupils up marvellously for the future.
- Continuing the trend of strengthening standards in modern languages, this year's German results were incredibly impressive and demonstrated an upward trajectory over a number of years, with 88.2% grades at 9-6 (A**-B).

A bright future ahead

Sixth Form awaited our fantastic pupils and we were confident that our pupils had the potential to excel again at the next level. A record number of our students went into BGS Sixth Form this year. We can't wait to see what this generation can achieve in Sixth Form and beyond!



Once again, Bury Grammar Sixth Form students succeeded in a whole range of subjects, reflecting the eclectic mix of our Sixth Form.

- Further Maths and German had a full house of 100% A* grades.
- All three challenging modern language A Levels French, German and Spanish - along with Theatre Studies, had a clean sweep of 100% A and A and A* grades.
- In what is becoming a Bury Grammar School trend, in the Extended Project Qualification (EPQ) - which is very highly valued by universities because it demonstrates independence of thought and excellent research skills – every single grade was once again either an A or A*.
- Computer Science, Geography, Music and Religious Studies also achieved outstanding results with 100% grades at A*-B.



More than 90% of students obtained a place on their 1st or 2nd choice course, the majority at Russell Group universities.



Social sciences were extremely popular this year as nearly a third of BGS sixth formers are reading Business, Economics or Management.



One in ten of our students were inspired to gain places on health-related courses - in Medicine, Veterinary Science, Dentistry, Genetics and Nursing.



One in six BGS sixth formers are pursuing STEM courses in Higher Education – Engineering, Pure Mathematics, Physics and Computer Science.



Three students are reading Law.

Reflecting the range of interests of our students, other popular university courses for BGS students included Marketing, Psychology, Modern Languages, English, Criminology, Drama, Fashion Design and Politics... and the vast majority stayed in the North.

Our A Level results demonstrated once again the strength of every department and the university courses chosen by our students reflected the diverse nature of our student body.

Alongside their studies, a number of our students also found time to volunteer in hospitals and care homes, help make PPE and write to elderly people who may have felt lonely during the pandemic.

'Value added' refers to the difference between a pupil's expected grade and the actual final grade they achieved. These IQ tests, or tests of 'innate' ability are carried out by the CEM Centre; they were pioneered by the University of Durham, and more recently, the University of Cambridge has been involved. The hallmark of a Bury Grammar School education has long been very strong value added, demonstrating the difference our teachers and school environment make to pupils' progress. Once again, our pupils have surpassed themselves thanks to their grit, determination and expert teacher guidance. REFLECTIONS a family.
