PURPOSE

The purpose of this document is to describe Hattiesburg Public Schools Plan for Cursive Writing in accordance with the Mississippi Legislature Senate Bill 2273 passed on July 1, 2017, that requires all public school districts to meet the following elementary education curriculum standard for cursive writing in support of the Mississippi College-and-Career- Readiness Standards for English Language Arts:

The standard course of study shall include the requirement that the public schools provide instruction in cursive reading and writing, implemented across the curriculum, so that students create readable documents through legible cursive handwriting by the end of the fifth grade, and that students pass with proficiency a teacher-constructed test demonstrating the students' competency in both reading and writing cursive. This requirement shall be applicable beginning with the 2018-2019 school year.

INTRODUCTION

Cursive handwriting is any style of penmanship in which some characters are written joined together in a flowing manner that is always looped and connected. In an effort to implement instruction pertaining to cursive writing, Hattiesburg Public Schools embraces the following benefits and ideals of cursive writing outlined in the Mississippi Department of Education Cursive Writing Guidance Document:

- Cursive writing may allow students to write at a faster rate than traditional block print handwriting.
- Cursive writing may increase brain activity.
- Cursive writing may impact performance across all disciplines.
- Cursive writing may provide a foundation for higher-order thinking skills.
- Cursive writing may directly affect the ability of students to read historical documents written in cursive handwriting.
- Cursive writing may allow students opportunities for options of creativity and choice in their style of writing penmanship.

HPS CURSIVE HANDWRITING ASSESSMENT OUTLINE GRADES 3-5

GRADE 3	The concept of cursive writing and beginning steps for cursive writing is introduced in the 3rd grade. Students are provided opportunities to practice the proper formation of cursive letters. Teachers may provide brief informal assessments and daily work practice for cursive in the 3rd grade.
GRADE 4	 Beginning with 2018-2019 SY, a mandatory cursive handwriting assessment is given to all HPS 4th graders to demonstrate proficiency. HPS 4th grade students will be assessed during the 2021-2022 school year in Spring 2022, with specific testing dates to be determined. Students must score 10 points or higher on the HPSD Cursive Handwriting Rubric to obtain proficiency. HPS Cursive Writing Assessment Rubric https://drive.google.com/open?id=1RB7yOdc19G36P_t8T9UhvDjNA995w_gKxIBS485FiJO Students who fail to meet the proficiency requirements on the initial cursive handwriting assessment in 4th grade will have additional opportunities to retest by the end of their 4th grade school year. HPSD files evidence of students' cursive handwriting proficiency in the cumulative record folders for access and verification with students' State Assessment scores.
GRADE 5	 During the 2020-2021 SY, 4th graders (current 5th-grade students) were not assessed. Therefore, HPS 5th grade students will be assessed during the 2021-2022 school year in Spring 2022, with specific testing dates to be determined. Students must score 10 points or higher on the HPS Cursive Handwriting Rubric to obtain proficiency. HPS files evidence of students' cursive handwriting proficiency in the cumulative record folders for access and verification with students' State Assessment scores.

PARENT COMMUNICATION

- Hattiesburg Public Schools will discuss and provide communication regarding the purposes of cursive writing to parents.
- Hattiesburg Public Schools will encourage parents to support cursive writing practice at home. For example, at-home activities for cursive are,
 - Parents and students practice cursive writing at home and compare handwriting styles for fun.
 - Parents and students work together to write advertisements or create signs in cursive for different products.
 - Parents and students write letters using cursive and send those correspondences to relatives and friends or to someone in the military.

Hattiesburg Public Schools will work with students, teachers, and parents to support proficiency in cursive writing by the end of fifth grade for students. Additionally, as students progress in academic grades, they should have opportunities to choose to write in manuscript/traditional print or cursive and to choose the type of handwriting that is best for their strengths. Equipping students with the necessary academic reading, writing, and language skills needed for success is the focus of Hattiesburg Public Schools as it embraces both the cursive handwriting requirements as well as the computer keyboarding skills needed throughout the grade levels to read, write, comprehend, and communicate effectively.
