This can encompass Fashion, Figure, Portrait or Landscapes.


Each individual's project is tailored through oneto-one tutorials to incorporate personal ideas and interests in a supportive and enriching environment.

Your work will be presented in a sketchbook in order to highlight your creative and technical development. Your journey will lead to a substantial portfolio of coursework, demonstrating your achievements.

You will have the opportunity to engage with professional artists, photographers and designers to help inspire you in creating unique and exciting works of art. This in turn will inspire you to explore beyond the surface of an image, interrogating meaning, aesthetic and worth.

Through critical analysis you will make informed decisions of your work that will evidence your increasing knowledge and skill in appropriate textile processes and concepts, all the while fulfilling your creative potential.

WHAT COURSES ARE ON OFFER?

A LEVEL PHOTOGRAPHY - AQA

√ Component 1

Personal Investigation - 60% of A Level (96 marks) Students are to conduct a practical investigation, into an issue, concept or theme, supported by written material.

✓ Component 2

Externally Set Assignment 40% of A Level (96 marks)

Following a preparatory period, students must complete 15 hours of unaided, supervised time.

INTERNATIONAL BACCALAUREATE VISUAL ARTS

Visual Arts with a focus on photography is offered at both Standard and Higher Level. The core teaching is the same at both levels but Higher Level gives greater depth to experimentation and realisation of intent..

- ✓ Part 1: Comparative study External assessment: 20%
- ✓ Part 2: Process Portfolio External assessment: 40%
- ✓ Part 3: Exhibition Internal assessment: 40%
