The History Department at Stonyhurst aims to develop interest in both Modern and Early Modern History. Topics can be selected from the eleventh to the twentieth century.

We aim to develop the knowledge and understanding of as wide a range of periods as possible and to take advantage of the spectacular array of source material that is available to us in the Stonyhurst Museum and Archives.

Students are very well prepared for university, as demonstrated by the high levels of success achieved in further education by former students in recent years.

Those who have studied History are generally very capable of reasoning independently and of expressing their ideas clearly. There is an obvious correlation between the study of History and careers in Law, Journalism and the Media.
