Community Council Minutes

Meeting

March 18, 2021

4:00 pm

Members in attendance – Connie Stanger, Mrs. Sandra Carmony, Mr. Pearson, Rachel Parrish, Keven M and Char Beck.

Welcome & Approval of Minutes

- Sandra Carmony welcomed the committee and minutes from the previous meeting approval. Connie motioned to Approve. Nicole Flink seconded the approval.

2020-2021 SIP Trust Land Amendment

- Amendment was approved and no questions from the committee regarding the amendment.

2019-2020 Report on Goals

- Mrs. Carmony presented the Parkside Goals for the 2019-2020 – and goals for the upcoming year. Important items of note were that reading proficiency goals were not able to be measured due to the soft closure during the 2020 pandemic. #1 Reading proficiency goal was not met due to the closure, the #2 goal was not met for technology, #3 Goal – Math and Science there was not enough available data to meet the goal. #4 Goal of the Hope Squad and Mental Awareness was met. In sum, goals 1-3 were not met due to the circumstances of the pandemic. Goal #4 has been met for the 2019-2020 school year.
- For the 2020-2021 school year, Mrs. Carmony noted that Parkside’s K-3 Literacy goal is making progress but remains concerned about the students who remain behind in proficiency. Parkside’s Team is keeping a good watch on the data and through a systematic approach to identify and K-3 grader who is below proficient will be invited to a summer reading program to increase literacy goals.

2020-2021—Progress on Goals

The English as a Second language goal is making progress towards proficient. No students have graduated from the WEDA program yet.

Parkside is making progress towards Goal #3.

Goal #4 – Mental – Making progress towards goal. Some updates include the creation of a calming room and SEL committee is working through the next steps.

2021-2020—Discussion on Goals and Budget

- Based on the Oct 1 enrollment, Parkside had seen a reduction of the budget from \$66,000 to \$54,000.
- The committee discussed the proposed goals for the 2021-2022 School Year.

Goal #1: The percentage of students performing at “typical or better progress” on Acadience EOY benchmark testing will increase by 5% from the previous year’s EOY benchmark.

Goal #2: The increase the percentage of ESL students making adequate progress by 3% from the previous year.

- This is important because the number of ESL students has risen from 16% to 21%.

Goal #3: 75% 4-6 grade students making typical progress from the BOY benchmark to EOY iReady Math benchmarks.

- iReady Math will be replacing imagine math.
- Parkside will also be considering a stretch goal for those that are exceeding the proficiency iReady.

Goal #4: SEL – No Funding will be allotted to this goal.

The goal will be focused on restorative practices and other items that are identified through the walk-through tool but no funding will be attached to this goal.

Proposed New Funding for the 2021- 2022 School Year was presented by Mrs. Carmony. The line items for the Trust Land \$54,064 budget were discussed as well as information provided on the TSSA and ESSR and Cares budgets.

Voting

The committee voted on goals for the 2021-2022 and the Trust Land Budget Expenditures. Connie Stanger motioned to approve the goals and budgeted expenditures, Keven M and Nicole Flink seconded. There will be no meeting in April. The committee members will need to electronically approved the items when sent to the district.

Connie motioned to adjourn the meeting and Mrs. Carmony seconded.
