#### A Note from Sister Rayleen...



As I reflect upon this new school year, what has passed and what is yet to come, I am reminded of the words of a homily that are often referred to as the *Romero Prayer*. This "prayer" begins with the words: "It helps, now and then, to step back and take the long view..." Paradoxically, these long months of responding to a highly contagious virus have found many of us unable to make plans, to take a "long view." Since March of 2019, we have found ourselves taking small, measured steps. Poignantly, however, Fr. Untener's homily goes on to remind me/us that for those of us who are about something much bigger than ourselves and/or who do God's work, it is essential to focus on the long view. He asserts: "Nothing we do is complete... We plant the seeds that one day will grow. We water seeds already planted, knowing that they hold future promise... We may never see the end results, but that is the difference between the master builder and the worker. We are workers, not master builders; ministers, not messiahs. We are prophets of a future not our own." For me, these are words of encouragement, as well as great reminders of the ministry we - parents, grandparents, faculty, and staff - undertake each day. May they encourage each and every one of us as we continue to negotiate these strange times. May we trust that we are growing a future full of promise.

### Do You Shop at Stop & Shop?

#### **Parking Lot Safety**

Vehicles must maintain traffic flow on Fisher Road and in the parking lot until they are either in the early bird line or in a parking spot. Per the Cumberland Police Department, at no time can Fisher Rd be blocked. If the line for the main entrance to drop off or pickup is stopped on Fisher Rd, vehicles must pull into the lot and park until the line starts moving. Cars in the early bird line should be parked close together to allow for more vehicles on our property and not on Fisher Rd. Also, please remember to back into your parking spaces. Please pass this information to anyone in your family that may drop off or pick up a child in school.
