IRISH TAKE HOMECOMING GAME OVER DIVINE CHILD

The Notre Dame Varsity Football team moved to 4-1 on the season with a 28-14 win over Divine Child on Homecoming. After a scoreless opening quarter, the Irish got on the board in the second quarter courtesy of a two yard run by Bradon Prater. The Falcons would answer late in a defensive-dominated first half with a five yard rushing score to send the teams to the locker room knotted at 7-7. Notre Dame would score twice in the third quarter, both on passing touchdowns. Jacob Tuttle hit Johnny Dreer for a 18 yard touchdown before finding Prater for a 16 yard score to up the lead to 21-7. Divine Child closed the gap to 21-14 before a second Tuttle to Dreer touchdown, this time from 11 yards out, put the game away. Jeremy Gale and Chris Galle both finished with five tackles to lead the Notre Dame defense, with Galle adding six tackle assists. Evan McGhee rushed 17 times for 136 yards, including an 81 yard run, while Prater had 60 rushing yards and a touchdown. Tuttle was an efficient 17 of 22 for 171 and three touchdowns, with Dreer leading all Irish receivers with 47 yards and two scores. Gale added five catches for 46 yards with Alex Scherle adding 36 receiving yards.

NOTRE DAME, ARMADA PLAY TO DRAW

The Notre Dame Boys Varsity Tennis team played to a 4-4 draw against Armada. Nico Fandino picked up the lone singles win for the Irish at third singles. The doubles pairings of Alex Housey and Trevor Rowe (second) and Matt Kafarski and Aidan Mehta (third) each earned three set wins while the fourth doubles pairing of Adam Hak and Beck Silver won in straight sets.

NOTRE DAME RUNNERS COMPETE AT LINDEN

The Notre Dame Girls and Boys Cross Country teams competed in the Linden Classic, otherwise known as the "mud bowl" on Saturday, placing fifth and eighth overall, respectively, in the large school division comprised of DI and DII schools. The Linden course, which is often the site of the MHSAA Regional championship tends to collects water and mud near the finish line, but after three days of torrential downpours, the course was muddy from beginning to end. The team, missing a few key Varsity runners did not disappoint. Freshman Maria Nunning was the top finisher (eighth overall) for the Irish with a time of 22:47, which was a personal record (PR) despite the mud. Seniors Anna Hauck (21st) and Kate Stacey (26th) also medaled for Notre Dame by finishing in the top 30 overall. Sophomore Addie Bellows and senior Jessie Kennedy rounded out the scoring for the team, almost. Notre Dame was tied with Wixom St. Catherine at 116 points after the first five runners crossed the finish line, which is normally how meets in cross country are scored. The tie was created by Notre Dame's sixth and seventh runners, freshman Erin Connelly and senior Nicole Carson, both finishing ahead of St. Catherine's fifth place runner, pushing their overall team score back. Connelly's finish (Notre Dame's sixth place runner) ahead of St. Catherine's sixth place runner was the tiebreaker. In the boy's race, sophomore Wade Robinson led the Irish with a fifth place finish and time of 18:04. Junior Ben Kincade, freshman Sam Phillips, sophomore Troy Kilanowski and freshman Chris Hunter rounded out the scoring for the Irish. Juniors John Milback and Thomas Belej also ran varsity. For Robinson, it was his fifth straight

top five performance of the season. Despite the conditions, freshman Lucas Lanfear ran a PR by almost a minute in the junior varsity race, joining Nunning and freshman Erin Galbraith as the only athletes to PR on the day. Afterwards, coach Guest commented "I think it was fun for the kids to run in the mud. The conditions were nasty and probably accounted for a good minute, to minute ten, slower performance for the athletes, but they all stuck it out in the mud, literally. I was surprised to see how well they all cleaned up for the homecoming dance later in the evening".

IRISH, DCDS BATTLE TO 1-1 DRAW

The Notre Dame Boys Varsity Soccer team battled to a 1-1 draw at Detroit Country Day in a potential MHSAA District 40 preview. The Irish took a 1-0 lead into halftime, as Massimo Vitale scored from 40 yards out midway through the half with an assist going to Will Lanham. The Yellow Jackets would get the equalizer early in the second half and neither team, despite chances on both end, would be able to break the tie. Goalkeeper Owen Theime finished with six saves in goal for Notre Dame on the night.

IRISH SWEEP MATCH OVER REGINA

The Notre Dame Varsity Volleyball team made it 35 straight wins to open the 2021 season with a 25-15, 25-15, 25-14 win over defending Catholic League champion Warren Regina. The Irish once again used a balanced attack with Sophia Sudzina leading the way with seven kills. Bianca Giglio added six and Aly Borellis had five. Borellis also added six serving points, four blocks, and 12 assists. Defensively for the Irish, Josie Bloom once again stood out as she finished with 14 digs, 13 serve receptions without an error and six points from the service line. Hanna Rutila played well with six receptions and six digs while Leah Greif pitched in wit nine assists. Elyssa Wallace and Ally Berent each served up five points and added an ace in the victory.

JV GIRLS GOLF GETS WIN OVER OXFORD
