Jacks jump back into full-time school

Let's call it the new old normal.

Certain things about the 2021-22 school year will be different, but the Quincy School District remains committed to bringing things back to normal in the most efficient way possible. In this regard, many things will be similar to the way they were prior to the start of the pandemic.

"We are just so excited to welcome our students full-time and in-person," said Assistant Superintendent of Quincy schools Dr. Nik Bergman. "Our staff has been working incredibly hard to be ready to welcome students on Sept. 1st."

All schools and all grade levels will open full-time. Daily classes will start and end at their pre-pandemic start and end times, and, Monday will once again be a late-start day. All Quincy School District facilities will be fully open to serve the public.

Athletics are expected to return with regular sports for Fall Season in the Caribou Trail League (volleyball, cross country, girls' soccer and football) taking place from September to early December. The first Fall home athletic contest is Sept. 3.

Though schools will not screen or check students' temperatures prior to

entering the school buildings at this time, the district is expecting parents to be responsible for monitoring their children daily for COVID-19 symptoms. If your child shows symptoms, please keep your child home and notify their school. The state board of health is not requiring that children be vaccinated, but vaccination is encouraged for all eligible students. However, all staff, volunteers and substitutes are required to be vaccinated.

Masks are required for all Washington state students, staff, visitors and volunteers, regardless of vaccination status, at all school facilities. All students must wear a mask that covers their nose, mouth and chin while riding the district's school buses. Students will not be required to wear masks at recess.

"We all learned things last year that will help us better navigate the pandemic," Boyd said.

Asked what had the district learned, Boyd said "We have learned how to keep kids safe, with masking and distancing and our cleaning and ventilation protocols. We also developed new ways to deliver instruction and support to staff, students and families."

Students returning this year will have to follow similar COVID-19 guidelines as they did during the 2020-2021 school year such as wearing a mask while in school and social distancing.

Last year provided an opportunity to enhance the district's digital education plans. Quincy students and teachers turned to technology to continue teaching and learning, remotely.

"Teachers did such a nice job stepping up to the plate last year, and this year they will continue using

the technology available to them to provide a high-quality educational experience, in person," Bergman said.

"We are excited to move forward and continue supporting our students and offering an education that will help to fulfill Quincy's Promise," Boyd said.

What a Difference a Year Makes!

At this time last year, Quincy School District was planning for a full remote instructional model with no in-person activities and no athletics. We worked throughout the summer of 2020 to develop a robust plan for remote instruction and while I am

incredibly proud of what we delivered for students; we know it fell short of what we can do when students are physically in our buildings with our teachers. Fast forward to this year, and we are planning to bring all students back into school buildings on a more typical school schedule with in-person clubs, activities, and a return to a normal fall sports schedule. We are so excited to welcome our students, families, and staff back to school as we once knew it. What a difference a year makes!

As we move into this new school year, we will continue to innovate and

improve how we instruct and support our students. We will also continue to provide school meals at no cost from our food services program. With our levy and federal stimulus funds, we have added mental health support to address the needs of our SEL students due to the stress of the past year and a half. This includes funding mental health counselors, medical assistants and STEAM summer school staff. We know social-emotional skills are equally as important as academic skills for our students' success. Starting this fall, all K-12 students will have access to a full

social-emotional learning (SEL) curriculum. Another important lesson learned from the pandemic is using parent and student interviews and surveys as an essential part of District planning efforts. The information gained from our family surveys and interviews was used in our 21-22 reopening planning. In November, all families will have another opportunity to provide valuable input during the student-led conferences.

I want to thank the Quincy Valley Community for your unwavering support of our children and families. Thank you for your patience over these

difficult two years during the pandemic. Thank you for your ongoing support as we continue to face the realities of COVID-19 and aspire to fulfill Quincy's Promise that all students graduate from high school and are ready for the next step in their career, education, and life! I am humbled by how much people in this community care for our most valuable resource, the children. I am looking forward to seeing you this school year at athletic events, open houses, and school performances, and I am excited to see what a difference we can make this year.

QSD inducts Wall of Fame recipients for 2020 and 2021

Five individuals have been chosen to be inducted as the class of 2021 to the Quincy School District's Wall of Fame.

The five people include costume designer Colleen Atwood, former coaches and educators William "Alex" Alexander and Arnold Ybarra, and former athletic standouts Mike Royer and Cole Webley.

According to a press release issued by the district, the future inductees "have brought honor to themselves, our schools and the community."

Colleen Atwood is an accomplished creative talent in the field of cinematic costume design. Her accomplishments include winning four Academy Awards in Costume Design for the movies "Chicago," "Memoirs

of a Geisha," "Alice in Wonderland," and "Fantastic Beasts and Where to Find Them." Atwood attended school in Quincy from third grade through high school and remains active in the filmmaking industry.

William "Coach Alex" Alexander is a former Quincy High School teacher, football coach, and athletic director, as well as the winningest football coach in Quincy High School history with 93 wins, and a member of the Washington State Coaches Association Hall of Fame. Coach Alex's career at Quincy spanned from 1990 until he retired in 2017.

Arnold Ybarra was a beloved Quincy High School wrestling, football, tennis coach as well

as an instructional support staff member. Ybarra served in the Quincy School District for over 25 years and was known for his humor, kindness, compassion, and support of Quincy student athletes and programs. He died of complications from diabetes in 2016.

Mike Royer was an athlete for the Jacks from 1975-1978, and still holds many individual basketball records. During Royer's time at Quincy, he led the Jacks to 3rd and 6th place finishes at the state basketball tournament. Royer also earned 1st Team All-State honors in 1978 and continued his athletic career at George Fox University. Royer currently is a school counselor in Oregon.

Cole Webley played

football, baseball and wrestled for Quincy before graduating in 2001. His accomplishments include 1,000 yards rushing in a season, a state baseball championship and three trips to the state wrestling tournament, including a runner-up finish in 2001. Mr. Webley now directs TV commercials, including some that have aired during the Super Bowl.

Recipients will be inducted during halftime at the second home football game on Sept. 24 at Quincy High School. Plaques will be displayed on the wall outside the Quincy High School gym.

The Class of 2020 Hall of Fame recipients will also be inducted this season. At the Sept. 3 home football game, the class

of 2020 recipients will be inducted during halftime since they were not able to be last year due to COVID-19. Their plaques have already been installed at the high school. The 2020 class includes Bill Sund, Chuck McConnell, Joe Downs, Larry Spence, Scott Alexander, Stuart Hunt, the 1998 State Champion Baseball Team and the 2014 State Champion Boys Soccer Team.

Meet your school board directors: Heather Folks-Lambert

What is your hometown?

I grew up in North Seattle. I left the city after high school to pursue a degree in Animal Science in Nebraska and then worked for several years in rural Kansas. After 4 years in Kansas, it was time to get closer to family and it became clear that living in a major city wasn't for me. I started looking for work in smaller communities in Washington and that's when I landed in Quincy, working for Simplot.

How long have you been on the board?

I've just been sworn in as a board member this month.

How long have you lived in the Quincy area?

I've worked in Quincy since 2002 and have lived in town for 10 years. It's been exciting to watch Quincy growing over the years and I feel very lucky to be here. I'm very fortunate to be raising my kids in a community of kind, hard-working people. It doesn't hurt that we're in such a sweet spot in the state, with so many great outdoor activities within easy reach.

What is your favorite hobby?

I'm interested in lots of things, so it's hard to pick just one. I travel for both work and leisure. (I'm so glad to come home to Quincy.) In recent years I've learned to can, hike, tried snow shoeing, and started knitting again. We've also been getting a great deal of entertainment from our chickens over the last year. I have to say that reading everything I can has always been my favorite pastime. Learning never stops.

What would you be doing if not on the board?

If I weren't on the board, I think I'd be doing many of the same things I'm doing now. I've just started a master's degree program focused on sustainability. I'm working as a quality and food safety leader for Amway and Trout Lake Farm, raising my kiddos and supporting their 4H club.

What made you want to be a board member?

Certainly, my kids are my priority and like everyone else, I want to give them the strongest start I can. There's growing evidence that high community engagement is one way to ensure academically successful schools. One of the things I'd like to focus my board energy on is finding ways to make it intuitive and easy for parents and the larger community to get even more involved with our schools. In recent years, it became very clear to me that what you do shows what you value. I value kids, education, and my community and I've been looking for ways to support the things that are important to me. When I saw that this position was available, it was a tremendous opportunity to bring all three of those things together.

What are some challenges you face on the board?

Obviously, these are challenging times for schools everywhere. It's critical that QSD is well positioned to recover from the difficulties of the last year. I'm spending a good deal of time right now working hard to get up to speed on all the work the board is doing so that I can contribute effectively.

What is exciting about being a board member?

I have two kids in the school system with many years ahead of us before graduation, so I'm deeply invested in the success of our schools. As I mentioned, education is a primary value in my family and so much of our success depends on our ability to access and decipher information accurately and to think critically. I'm incredibly excited to do everything I can to support our students in becoming life-long learners. There's a big world out there and I can't wait to see what Quincy kids will contribute.

Jackrabbit Jumpstart

LET'S GET A JUMPSTART ON LEARNING!

Beginning October 19, 2021, the Quincy School District will begin to provide early learning for students through the Jackrabbit Jumpstart Program.

Jackrabbit Jumpstart will provide a free, full-day early learning experience. The program will be located at Pioneer and Monument Elementary and can accommodate up to 36 students from across the Quincy School District. Busing will also be provided for program students.

To enroll in Jackrabbit Jumpstart, students must meet **all** the following requirements:

- Turn 4 years old by August 31 (cannot be 5 years old on August 31)
- Live within the Quincy School District boundary
- Cannot participate in Inspire or other early learning programs
- Expected to attend kindergarten in the fall of 2022

Students must also meet **one** of these qualifying criteria:

- Lack of access to a preschool/Inspire program (financial, availability, or another significant factor)
- Qualify for free/reduced meals
- A language other than English spoken in the home
- Exhibit lagging social/and or academic skills based on administered screening

If your student meets the criteria above, please pick up an interest form at the district office, Pioneer and Monument Elementary or visit qsd.wednet.edu.



NEW STUDENT REGISTRATION PROCESS

Parents must register children at the school of attendance. Immunization records are **required** to register. Birth certificates and records (previous school) may be helpful, but not necessary for enrollment.

RELEASE OF DIRECTORY INFORMATION

Federal law requires an annual reminder to parents that the school district is permitted to publicly release certain information about students such as name, photograph, address, telephone number, date and place of birth, dates of attendance, participation in officially recognized sports and activities, weight and height of members of athletic teams, diplomas and awards received and honor roll. Such information is not released for commercial purposes. The federal No Child Left Behind Act also requires that directory information be provided to military recruiters unless parents object. If parents or guardians do not wish such information released, they should notify the school principal. If there is no response, the principal will assume that there is no objection to the limited release of such information. We will make every reasonable effort to protect the privacy of students.

DISTRICT REPORT CARDS

Both state and federal laws currently require schools and districts to provide citizens with information about the schools. This information is provided so parents and other citizens can see how well the public schools are performing and make better judgments about how they can get involved in their communities to help all children succeed in the classroom. Quincy district reports can be accessed electronically from the district website (www.qsd.wednet.edu). Simply go to the home page of the district website and click on "District Report Card" on the quick links on the menu at the left side of the screen. District report links will then appear. Should you have no access to the internet or have trouble accessing this information, you may contact the school district office for assistance.

ELECTRONIC POSTING OF STUDENT GRADES AND MID-TERM PROGRESS REPORTS

In an effort to keep parents informed about student academic progress, teachers may post grades or other information for access via computer. At the secondary level, mid-term progress reports are provided in addition to quarter and semester grade reports. Due to unforeseen circumstances, grades posted electronically on any day other than the end of quarterly grading periods may be incomplete or not reflective of a student's final grade. Parents who have questions about any posted grades or progress reports are encouraged to contact the teacher by phone or email or by arranging a parent-teacher conference.

PARENT INVOLVEMENT

You can influence the success of your child by being an active participant in your child's school. Here are a few ways to become and stay connected:

1. **COME** on out and volunteer. Join school/parent groups, school improvement teams, be a helper to classroom activities, attend school/district meetings.
2. **COMMUNICATE**. Ask questions. Give feedback. Learn and grow with your child by monitoring their progress and contact your school about any concerns. Attend parent/teacher conferences or open house and school events such as family nights.
3. **COLLABORATE** with community by participating in parent activities with other families, stay involved in extra-curricular activities, know your local resources and agencies (public library, community center, health agencies).



TOBACCO USE ON SCHOOL PROPERTY

In compliance with state law, Quincy School District policy prohibits smoking or any other use of tobacco products on all school property. The public is asked to remember that the smoking ban includes all buildings and grounds and runs twenty-four hours a day. Also in compliance with state law and district policy, all school buildings, grounds and buses are drug-free and gun-free zones.



STUDENT INTERNET OPT-OUT FORMS

The Quincy School District uses an Internet user opt-out program. If you wish for your son/daughter **not** to have access to the Internet at school, please complete the opt-out form. Forms may be obtained at school offices.



PESTICIDE APPLICATION NOTIFICATION

QUINCY SCHOOL DISTRICT HIGHLY CAPABLE PROGRAM

Any person, including a parent, guardian, teacher or student, may nominate a student for Quincy School District's Highly Capable Program. It provides students of high academic and intellectual ability an opportunity to explore concepts in great depth and further develop their intellectual thinking and creativity. To participate in the Highly Capable Program, students must meet very rigorous criteria, be recommended for highly capable student identification and be selected by the District's Multidisciplinary Team.

To make a nomination, complete the Highly Capable Program Nomination form available at www.quincy.wednet.edu or at your student's school. In order for a student to be considered for this program, nominations should be returned to the student's school before the winter holiday break.



SPECIAL EDUCATION SERVICES AVAILABLE

To better serve students and to meet federal rules and regulations, the Quincy School District would like to know if your student is having difficulty in areas of development that cause you concern. First, talk to your student's teacher about your concerns. Every school has a process in place to provide help when there are concerns about student learning. You may also talk to the counselor or administrator from your school. One outcome of that process might be a referral for a special education assessment, for which your written permission is required. When assessment is completed, you will be invited to discuss the results and consider your child's eligibility for special education services. If eligible, you will help plan for your child's Individualized Education Program. If you have concerns about a child who is not yet in school, or questions regarding this process, please call the Quincy Special Services Office at (509) 787-8992.

TITLE I, PART A

Title I, Part A is a federal program that provides additional academic assistance to students needing the academic support in math, reading and English language arts to reach proficiency-to pass state assessments. The School-Parent-Student Compact is an annual agreement between each party joining in helping each student find success. Buildings also have written Parent Involvement Policies. PARENTS RIGHT TO KNOW

a. Teacher and Para Professional Qualifications-Parents of children in schools that receive Title I, Part A funding have the right to request and receive information about the professional qualifications of teachers and instructional paraprofessionals in their building.

b. OSPI's (Office of Superintendent of Public Instruction) Written Citizen Complaint Procedure-Any individual or organization may file a signed, written complaint if it believes the state, a local school district, an educational service district, or other sub-grantee has violated one or more requirements of federal statutes or regulations or state regulations that apply to federal programs.

ANNUAL ATTENDANCE NOTIFICATION

Under state law (RCW 28A.225), students are required to attend school full-time, without unexcused absences, skips or tardiness. When a student accumulates seven (7) days of unexcused absences in any month (one day consists of more than half a school day) or ten (10) days of unexcused absences in a school year, will be referred to a Community Engagement Board, and will result in a Becca Petition being filed with juvenile court where sanctions can be imposed to student/parents.

If a student misses twenty (20) consecutive days of school, they will be withdrawn from their school of attendance.

What can parents/guardians do?

- Contact the school immediately if your child has missed school.
- Ask the school about their policy and procedures on excusing absences from school.
- Respond quickly when the school notifies you of an unexcused absence.
- Learn how to check your student's attendance on the Skyward app.

If you are concerned about your child's attitude toward school and about his/her attendance record, contact your child's teacher, counselor and/or school principal. With the combined insights into your child's needs and interests, we can work together to design an individualized plan to help your child stay in school.
