Statement of Purpose:

Weslaco ISD is committed to working together with all parents, families, students, the community and other stakeholders to provide high quality, engaging, and innovative programs along the continuum of learning environments. strengthen academic achievement and success. These partnerships will create a positive impact on student achievement. Therefore, Weslaco ISD is committed to the following:

- Include the participation of parents in a regular, two-way, and meaningful communication involving student academic learning and other school activities.
- Parents are encouraged to be actively involved in their child's education at school and at home.
- Parents are full partners in their child's education and are included, as appropriate, in decision making and on advisory committees to assist in the education of their children.
- Weslaco ISD will collaborate with parents and families in the development of the District Improvement Plan and School Improvement Plan.
 - Weslaco ISD jointly approves the District Improvement Plan and School Improvement Plan at the District Advisory Committee (DAC) meetings.
- Weslaco ISD will involve parents of children served under Title 1, Part A in decisions about how Title 1, Part A funds are spent (campus Title 1, Part A meetings).
 - Title 1, Part A campus meetings are scheduled at a convenient time, to which all parents of participating children shall be invited and encouraged to attend, to inform parents of their school's participation under this part and to explain the requirements of this part, and the right of the parents to be involved.
- Weslaco ISD will jointly develop/revise with parents the district parent and family engagement
 policy and distribute it to parents of participating students and make it available to the
 community.
- Weslaco ISD will jointly conduct, with the involvement of parents, an annual evaluation of the content and effectiveness of the district parent and family engagement policy.

- Weslaco ISD will conduct an annual evaluation of the content and effectiveness of the Parent and
 Family Engagement Policy in improving the academic quality of Title 1, Part A program
 participating schools. The Title 1 Parent and Family Engagement Survey, is distributed to parents
 and families, and seeks to identify barriers that inhibit greater participation. The findings will be
 used to design strategies for more effective parent and family engagement and the policy will be
 revised as necessary.
- Weslaco ISD will ensure that information related to school and parent/family programs, meetings, and other activities is sent to the parents/families in a format and, to the extent practicable, in a language that parents can understand.
- Weslaco ISD will offer a flexible number of meetings, such as meetings in the morning or evening, and may provide, with funds under this part, childcare, home visits, as such services relating to parental engagement.
- Weslaco ISD will provide assistance to families in understanding such topics as the challenging State academic standards, State and local academic assessments, how to monitor a child's progress, and how to work with educators to improve the achievement of their children. - o Inform parents of all the different resources available to keep them informed and stay connected to the district and their campus.
- Weslaco ISD will schedule parent-teacher conferences (at least annually in elementary schools) during which the compact will be discussed as it relates to the individual child's achievement. Specifically, those conferences will be held as follow:
 - Parent-Teacher conferences are held annually, occurring after the completion of the first grading periods.
 - Additional conferences may be arranged by contacting the teacher.
- Weslaco ISD shall, to the extent feasible and appropriate, coordinate and integrate parental

 such as parent resource centers.
- Weslaco ISD shall educate teachers, specialized instruction support personnel, principals, and
 other school leaders, and other staff with the assistance of parents, in the value and utility of
 contributions of parents/families, and in how to reach out to, communicate with, and work with
 parents as equal partners, implement and coordinate parent programs, and build ties between the
 parents and the school.
 - Staff development is provided to each campus parental specialist to ensure best practices for family engagement.
 - WISD recognizes National Parental Day in November and National Volunteer Appreciation Week in April to emphasize the importance of partnerships between school and home.
 - Parental staff members meet with district and campus staff to communicate the importance of family engagement.
 - Provide parents reasonable access to campus administration, faculty, and staff. Staff must be accessible and responsive during remote learning.
 - Parents may contact the school at any time to arrange consultation with their child's classroom teacher.
 - Conferences may occur before, during, or after the school day via phone, email, virtually or in person when appropriate.
 - o Provide parents opportunities to volunteer in their child's school.
