

I. CALL TO ORDER/FLAG SALUTE

The August 17, 2021 Public Meeting of the Edison Township Board of Education was called to order by Board President, Mr. Jingwei (Jerry) Shi, at 6:00 P.M. at Edison High School, 50 Boulevard of Eagles, Edison, NJ.

II. ROLL CALL

Mrs. Kluck took the roll, and the following members were present:

Also in attendance were Bernard F. Bragen, Jr., Ed.D., Superintendent, Mrs. Ann T. Kluck, Assistant Business Administrator/Board Secretary, and Mr. John Shahdanian, Board Attorney.

III. OPENING STATEMENT

Mr. Shi read the following opening statement:

“The New Jersey Open Public Meetings Law was enacted to insure the right of the public to have advance notice of, and to attend the meetings of public bodies at which any business affecting their interests is discussed or acted upon.

In accordance with the provisions of this act, the Edison Township Board of Education has caused notice of this meeting to be published by having the date, time and place thereof posted in the Board of Education Administrative Offices. Copies of these notices were sent to the Home News and Tribune and the Star Ledger on January 5, 2021 and June 30, 2021.

The Public may participate at regular meetings in accordance with the By-Laws and the applicable State regulations.”

Christo Makroupoulos, resident, asked how many teachers and students have been vaccinated. He asked if the personnel have had training regarding COVID and felt the Board could not discriminate for anyone not vaccinated. He asked if there was a specific board member who put the resolution to the Governor on the agenda.

Rich Boslet, resident, asked what the Board Policy is if a student has COVID.

A resident asked why there were transfers in and out of the same health benefits account. Dr. Bragen responded that the health benefits transfer was a timing issue.

A resident thanked those who choose to go remote.

Jeff Bowden, ETEA President, asked how many other districts sent a request to the Governor regarding COVID-19.

## IX. COMMITTEE REPORTS

### 1. Township Liaison Committee

The Township Liaison Committee met on July 20, 2021 at 11:00 a.m. at the Education Center.

In attendance were: Council VP Sam Joshi, Councilwoman Joyce Ship-Freeman, Councilman Ajay Patil (via ZOOM), BOE VP Mohin Patel, BOE Members, Biral Patel, Virginia White and Superintendent Dr. Bernard Bragen. In addition, Dr. Edward Alderelli, Director of HR for the BOE, and Patrick Kissane, Director of School Safety and Security, were in attendance.

Also in attendance, via ZOOM, were Mayor Thomas Lankey, Deputy Fire Chief/OEM Coordinator Andy Toth, Assemblyman Robert Karabinchak, and Benjamin Ghiano (Aide to Assemblyman Karabinchak).

#### Items Discussed:

- Assemblyman Karabinchak was the first to address the group. The Board asked about the availability of Turf Fields for school fields. In the past, the county provided them for different sport fields. The condition being the fields must totally open for the public to use. The Board does not have an issue with that condition at all. It seems that the program changed and the County can no longer support any Board of Education property fields. Assemblyman Karabinchak proceeded to speak about additional state funding for school projects via the CARES Act. These monies have already been utilized in the District. Assemblyman Karabinchak mentioned a pilot program for Electric School Buses. He stated that the Bill was passed and said there is a program for athletes who sustain concussions. Dr. Bragen stated that the Board of Education already has a concussion protocol in place.

- Mr. Biral Patel asked if Edison will be part of the pilot project with Electric School Buses. Assemblyman Karabinchak said they are still waiting for state authorities to make a decision and spoke of a new bill for school energy efficiency stimulus to reduce power consumption.
- Edison Art Society – Ms. Gloria Dittman provided the Committee with an update. She is working along with Ms. Jennifer Blevins, Principal of Woodrow Wilson Middle School, and Mr. William Kolibas, Director of Buildings and Grounds, on the planters outside of Woodrow Wilson Middle School. The planters are huge and were in need of attention. When the project is completed, it will be a wonderful addition to the building. Ms. Dittman added that there are four murals in different parts of the Township, with more to come, as well as Amboy Avenue's unique pianos. Lastly, there is an exceptional display of art on the second and third floors of the Municipal Building and also at the Menlo Park Mall.
- Properties – Mayor Lankey provided the Committee with an update on Stelton School and Kilmer properties. He stated that there is good news regarding Stelton School. There is nothing standing in the way for the town to transfer the property to the schools and will recommend that the Town Council approve the property transfer. The Town Council will have to approve the transfer. It should be on their agenda for the August Council Meeting.
- The Kilmer Property, right now, is limited to parks and recreation. That needs to be changed before moving forward. The Mayor suggested having the Township Attorney speak with the Board of Education Attorney. Dr. Bragen will facilitate this. Furthermore, the question of potential contamination keeps arising. The Township is still attempting to locate studies.
- Dr. Bragen asked if the William Toth Health Center is still available and if that includes the fields behind the building. The Mayor confirmed that it is. Mr. Joshi inquired about the size of the area. Mayor Lankey thought it is approximately 4 acres. Dr. Bragen stated that the Board of Education is interested in possibly purchasing this property.
- COVID-19 Update – Deputy Chief Toth provided the Committee with a COVID-19 update. He indicated that Pfizer is the vaccine approved for people as young as 12 years of age. Mr. Jay Elliott, of the Edison Township Department of Health, is also working on this project. In addition, Deputy Chief Toth updated the Committee on the meeting with Ms. Ship-Freeman and Dr. Bragen and the plan to present an educational program for both High Schools in the fall regarding careers in the fire department.
- School Crossing Guards – Councilwoman Ship-Freeman researched some of the concerns regarding School Crossing Guards' absences and coverages. The Auxiliary Police cannot be used in that capacity. Mr. Kissane stated that the crossing guards are part of the police function. School security guards have duties inside the buildings and on school grounds.
- A Lengthy discussion followed. Dr. Bragen suggested that since there is a shortage of guards, possibly an increase in hourly pay is necessary. Mr. Mohin Patel asked if the possibility of volunteers can be an option. Mr. Joshi said he is not opposed to exploring the option of paying added benefits, ie: vision or dental, for motivation. Mayor Lankey said he would come up with a proposed plan to increase crossing guards. Most importantly, school crossings must be covered.
- Mr. Kissane provided background information on how the District decided to hire its own security officers instead of using Class 3 police officers from the Township. The bottom line was the significant savings from using Township police. Additionally, the District could retain more control over the security officers in this manner. He gave a complete update on school safety and security. He answered many questions and addressed many concerns.

3. Finance & Facilities Committee

The Finance and Facilities Committee met on July 19, 2021 at 4:30 p.m. in the Education Center.

In attendance were: Bernard F. Bragen, Jr., Ed.D., Ann T. Kluck, Assistant Business Administrator, Mohin Patel, Elizabeth Conway, Jingwei “Jerry” Shi

Items Discussed:

- Capital Reserve Funds
  - Current Capital Reserve - \$12.5 M
  - Addition this year - \$14.0 M
  - Total - \$26.5 M
    - Dr. Bragen reviewed these amounts and reminded the Committee that \$9 million was allocated for the Lincoln Elementary School addition and \$3.5 million for Our Savior’s Church Property and renovations for the Edison High School auditorium, leaving approximately \$14.5 million in the reserve account.
- Current Capital Amounts in 2021-2022 Budget for Building - \$17.4 M
  - This is the amount allocated for capital projects in this year’s budget that is currently unallocated.
- ESSERS III Capital Funds - \$7.8 M
  - Dr. Bragen shared that these additional federal grant monies are currently unallocated and can be used for capital projects to ease overcrowding.
- Online Bidding Software Proposal
  - The Committee approved securing the online bidding software from EC eSourcing Solutions at a cost not to exceed \$22,000.
- It was determined that Edison would need two additional elementary school locations to accommodate full-day kindergarten programs. The Committee is in the process of acquiring the property adjacent to the Menlo Park School and would need one on the south side of town as well.
- Representatives from DMR Architects are planning to visit John P. Stevens High School with Dr. Bragen and Ms. Pawlikowski to review proposed plans for expansion. This tour was scheduled for August 11, 2021.
- The proposed turf field at John P. Stevens High School is expected to cost between \$1.5 and \$2.0 million.
- The Committee will explore using fields for John P. Stevens High School athletes at both Polansky Park and the fields on Shamrock Way.

XI. BOARD MEMBERS – OPEN DISCUSSION

Mr. B. Patel spoke about the opening of the school year. He questioned if quarantine will be shorter for those vaccinated and asked if COVID testing is available.

Mrs. Madhukar reported that the Community Relations Committee will meet at 7:00 on August 30, 2021. She questioned the online bidding through EC eSourcing and their annual fee of \$22,000.

Mrs. Conway spoke about the Special Ed Parents Advisory Group with Dr. Toohey and questioned board members attending the new teacher meeting.

Mr. Shi discussed a plan for positive cases of COVID-19, contact tracing, 7 to 10 days quarantining, and full virtual (home) instruction. Mr. Shi asked the parents to open the Parent Portal early to confirm their child/children's information. He reported that bus passes would be on the Parent Portal.

XII. PUBLIC COMMENTS

Lisa Zarro, resident, was concerned about mask wearing and asked when will the compliance end.

Gabriel Howe, resident, discussed Occupational Therapy for students and asked for more choices for the children – in person/remote, BO not transparent with curriculum, schools should have more control over schools, blanket mandates never work and she felt that having no sidewalks near John Marshall Elementary School is a safety hazard.

Rich Bosslet, resident, questioned what would happen if one student had COVID in a school.

Sue Campione, resident, asked how the Board would be handling lunch tents. She discussed overcrowding in the schools and suggested an on-line academy. She felt the students should have the COVID vaccine.

Christo Makroupolus, resident, asked why the leaders are not wearing masks at this meeting. He discussed the contaminated property at Kilmer.

A resident stated they were overall impressed with the Board of Education.

Joyce Ship-Freeman, resident, discussed crossing guards and felt the vaccine should not be a political issue. She questioned the need for a preschool on the south side of Edison.

A resident asked if a second school should be Pre-K only or Pre-K and Kindergarten.

There being no further questions or comments forthcoming, Mr. Shi asked for a motion to adjourn this August 17, 2021 Public Meeting of the Edison Township Board of Education at 9:38 p.m. Mrs. Madhukar made the motion, seconded by Mrs. White and approved by all members present.
