COMMUNITY*

Consisting of 80,867 residents, the Brentwood community is a large, diverse, multicultural suburban community encompassing 10.06 square miles situated in the geographic center of Long Island. Located in the Town of Islip, (Suffolk County), Brentwood is bordered by the Long Island Expressway (I-495) to the north, and the Southern State Parkway to the south. The District is composed of eleven elementary schools, four middle schools, a freshman center, and a high school. The total student enrollment is over 19,373.

BRENTWOOD HIGH SCHOOL

Brentwood High School is a comprehensive senior high school (Grades 10-12) that is accredited by the New York State Education Department. The 2020-21 total student enrollment is 4,731 of which 1,369 students are seniors.

In 2021, the graduating class consisted of 1,291 students, of which, 84% continued to higher education and 16% selected work, military service or technical instruction.

Brentwood High School is a state-of-the-art facility, which includes computers in every classroom, four computer labs, two auditoriums, pool, research laboratories, professional television broadcasting studio, radio station, two libraries, and a wing devoted to the performing and visual arts.

CURRICULUM

Brentwood High School offers a variety of academic opportunities including: 17 AP classes, an array of Honors- level courses, Regents-level offerings, three second languages, comprehensive art and music programs, television broadcasting program, a full continuum of special education services, and a generous selection of elective courses drawn from all areas including technology, business, family & consumer science, and AFJROTC. CLASS RANK

Rank-in-class for students at Brentwood High School is based upon a quality point system that awards points both on the grade earned in a course and the degree of difficulty of the subject. The quality point rank is based on grades in all subjects. The student's rank is his/her relative position in the entire class, not his/her rank among college-bound students only. Each course is assigned a specific level that relates to its degree of difficulty, ranging from a 1.2 for Advanced Placement, 1.1 for Honors-level, and 1.0 for Regents-level classes.

A student must complete a minimum of 15 credits in order to enter the senior class and thereby be included in the class rank. In addition, he/she must pass four of the five required Regents examinations for graduation. All credits earned by a student at Brentwood High School or another accredited institution (college or high school) from the time that the pupil enters eighth grade are included in the class rank process, provided an official transcript (including grades and credits earned) is received by the counseling center. The total quality points will be divided by the total number of credits to determine a student's class rank.

EXTRA-CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

Brentwood High School is proud to offer numerous co-curricular clubs designed to make students' high school years most enjoyable, while promoting a sense of belonging, active leadership, and cultivating friendships. From Freshman Orientation to Senior Graduation, students have the opportunity to participate in a myriad of activities.
