

Driving Privileges for Glenbrook Off-Campus

Some students wish to drive to and from Off-Campus. We consider driving to be a privilege and not a right. In order to be granted this privilege they must meet certain expectations. These expectations are:

1. The student must be passing all classes with a C or better.
2. The student must attend school at a rate of 90% or higher including being on time and remaining for the entire day.
3. The student must have a job, or engage in a significant extracurricular activity such as a sport or being a regular volunteer.
4. The student must follow all school rules and have no more than one Minor behavioral incident per week.
5. The student may have no more than one Major behavioral incident per quarter. Failure to meet this expectation will result in the immediate revocation of their privilege.
6. The student must use his or her vehicle responsibly and safely. Students who use their vehicle in a disruptive, irresponsible or unsafe manner will have their driving privilege immediately revoked.
7. Students are expected to turn in their keys upon entry to the school. They may have their keys back when their school day at GBOC is over including staying for any assigned detentions. Failure to turn in keys or leaving school utilizing an additional set of keys will result in immediate termination of the driving privilege.

Students who fail to live up to the expectations will be warned that their behavior may jeopardize their ability to drive. In some cases, as detailed above, the driving privilege will be removed without warning.
