ATTENDANCE MATTERS

Now that the new academic year has started the government has issued updated guidance and expectations for schools relating to children's attendance. The regular attendance of all pupils is a high priority for us and our Trust due to the amount of learning time lost for children during the Covid 19 pandemic. As experienced educators, we are aware that any time missed from school can have an impact on a child's social and emotional development, learning opportunities and future life chances. At Dudley Infant Academy it is always our intention to work closely with parents and carers to ensure children attend school as much as possible. Each week here at the academy senior leaders hold a meeting to review pupil's attendance. There are government expectations upon us to address any child's attendance that causes concern and there are attendance percentage parameters that we use to support this. The government's target for each child is an overall attendance figure of 96% for the academic year. For attendance that causes concern, supportive intervention measures may be put in place to help families in ensuring their child has regular attendance at school. These can range from advisory letters being sent to parents and carers or meetings being arranged to discuss any barriers to a child's attendance. In some cases, supportive attendance improvement plans may be developed with the school and parents/carers. Arriving at school on time is also an important area of attendance that is reviewed regularly and similar strategies to the ones mentioned above can be utilised if needed. Pupils who are late may miss out on important phonics learning sessions that happen first thing daily here at Dudley. This in turn may affect their progress in reading.

It is important to note that all parents and carers have a legal obligation to ensure that their child attends school regularly. In some cases, failure to do so can lead to fines being issued by the Local Authority.

As previously mentioned, it is always our intention to work with our families to achieve regular attendance of pupils. If you feel that there are any barriers to your child attending, please do not hesitate to call the academy office team who will be happy to arrange a meeting with your child's class teacher or senior staff member to discuss how we can support you.

Thank you for ensuring your child attends school regularly and receives the education they truly deserve.
