LAKE HIGHLAND PREPARATORY SCHOOL

Since 1970, Lake Highland Preparatory School (LHP) has delivered a remarkable education characterized by extraordinary educational and experiential opportunities. LHP is the 10th largest coeducational independent day school in the nation and educates approximately 2,000 students in grades PreK through 12 in a rigorous college preparatory program. The school's focus is simple: inspire students to pursue their potential to learn, lead, serve, and change the world.

COVID-19 Response

In response to COVID-19, LHP moved to distance learning in March 2020. Students were issued standard letter grades for the 2019-2020 school year. We began the 2020-2021 school year in a hybrid model with most students attending class in-person and some attending our digital campus. Class sizes were reduced to allow for social distancing in the classroom. As of August 12, 2021, all students are attending LHP in-person.

Upper School Curriculum

Students at Lake Highland who meet specific requirements have the option of three main levels of academic study: College Preparatory, Honors and Advanced Placement. If certain requirements are met, it is also possible for students to design their own courses of study by taking classes from each level. Course offerings include 78 advanced courses designated "Honors" in the course title and 31 Advanced Placement courses.
