OVERVIEW

Edison is designed as a college preparatory high school that serves students with varied abilities in an academically rigorous environment that is geared towards preparing students for college and career readiness. Advanced Placement (AP) courses are the cornerstone of the magnet program and Edison has the unique distinction of offering the AP Capstone Diploma. Edison is repeatedly recognized by the *US News and World Report* as one of the state's premier high schools. The school features numerous highly recognized programs in world languages, performance arts, visual arts, leadership, and creative writing opportunities providing students with a comprehensive educational experience. For several years, major universities and colleges have actively recruited Edison Preparatory students.

Edison Preparatory School is unique within the Tulsa Public Schools System as it serves students grades 6 through 12 ensuring a well-articulated and challenging curriculum for its diverse student body. Located on 44 acres in the heart of Tulsa since 1954, Edison is geared towards academic excellence, student achievement, and making positive contributions to the community.

TYPE OF SCHOOL

Edison Preparatory School is a public high school. Since 2002 it has possessed a unique academic magnet program within the school for students that have successfully met the application criteria. Although all students are encouraged to engage in the most rigorous coursework applicable to their strength, the magnet program students are required to enroll in a minimum number of Advanced Placement courses. Students that have the desire to pursue the "Magnet" program must make application. Qualified applicants are selected by academic merit and test scores. Edison is accredited by the State of Oklahoma.
