- 17 schools offer free breakfast and lunch to all students based on federal guidelines.
- Data on student meal participation and menu selections is analyzed daily by grade, school and the district for continuous improvement.
- More than 3.3 million meals were served last school year.
- 4,000 parents and teachers participated in the optional school Thanksgiving dinner service.
- Last year, USDA provided the Child Nutrition Program with 535,156 pounds of commodity goods.
- Fresh salads are offered in Ascension's middle and high schools.
- Students in after-school tutoring programs are provided healthy snacks.
- The District employs more than 200 child nutrition workers in the schools.

- Ascension Public Schools' bus fleet is comprised of 280 buses, including 26 for students with special needs.
- 246 full-time bus drivers and 20 substitute drivers receive safety training twice a year.

- The Maintenance Department completed more than 7,000 work orders during the last school year--that averages to one work order every 18 minutes.

PLANNING AND CONSTRUCTION

Designing, Planning and Building Efficiently for Today and Tomorrow



To provide an adequate quantity of effective school buildings and instructional spaces

To meet the challenges of a growing parish, the district is investing \$120 million in improvements and new construction. These improvements come at no increased annual cost to taxpayers. Some of the notable projects include:

Exterior covered play pavilions are being constructed at primary school campuses, giving students a safe, clean play area.

New facilities completed in 2017 include Donaldsonville High's library, East Ascension High's Freshman Academy, Dutchtown High's Freshman Academy and St. Amant High's Freshman Academy.

Three new primary schools and one new middle school are under construction or in the design/development phase. Site planning is also underway for a future high school.

HOW TO BUILD A SCHOOL

The average time to design, permit and construct a school after funding is secured ranges from 2 to 3 years, depending on the size of the school and number of campus facilities. Below is the breakdown of the process and typical timelines:

1) Secure Funding: Typically, new schools are funded by construction millages authorized by taxpayers in a bond election.

2) Pre-Design: Staff secures documents and surveys such as population, environmental, drainage, wetlands and traffic studies needed for the architect to begin design of the school. (4-6 months)

3) Design: An architectural firm is selected to design the school. (8-12 months, depending on size of school)

4) Permitting & Bidding: Staff secures construction permitting while a construction firm is selected through a public bidding process. (30-45 days)

5) Construction: Site preparation and construction of the school commences. (12-22 months)

6) Warranty: All new work is under warranty after the end of the construction phase in case additional work is needed. (1 year)

DID YOU KNOW:

In order to accommodate growth and improve transition to high school, all four high schools have freshman academies. Dutchtown High, East Ascension High and St. Amant High also have new classroom additions that increased student capacity by an additional 600 students, which combined (1,800) is equivalent to the capacity of a new high school campus.

Freshman Academies are proven to:

- Enhance student academic performance
- Improve classroom behavior
- Increase graduation rates

FLOOD RESTORATION



Ascension Public Schools has spent \$63 million of the total estimated \$80 million cost for flood restoration projects at six schools and three district properties. To date, the district has been reimbursed for \$22 million and is awaiting an additional \$49 million approved by FEMA.

All flooded schools will be back in their restored buildings this school year.

This is a tremendous accomplishment, as the scope of work is equivalent to building five new schools in two years.



- Ascension Public Schools is the largest employer in the parish, with 78% of its annual budget dedicated to employee salaries and benefits.
- Ascension Public Schools has been nationally and internationally recognized for fiscal excellence for multiple years.
- The District's AA Credit Rating reflects conservative management by setting aside significant funds to address capital needs related to growing enrollment. This high credit rating allows the District to save tens of thousands of dollars over the life of the bonds.
- Ascension Public Schools has been recognized with the Distinguished **Budget Presentation Award for four** consecutive years and with the Excellence in Financial Reporting Award for the last three years.

- Ascension Public Schools has a comprehensive employee benefits program, including dental and vision coverage in its comprehensive medical plan.
- Ascension Public Schools has implemented an award-winning Teach Ascension Academy to train professionals for teaching careers.



- Professional development through extension courses, university-based workshops and conferences and other credential-building opportunities are readily available to our instructional teachers and leaders.
- Twelve supervisors, principals and teachers earned doctoral degrees from state universities over the past two years.



- Ascension Public Schools won the coveted National School Public Relations Association Gold Medallion Award for excellence in a school information campaign.
- Internal and external stakeholders receive weekly and monthly electronic messages from the District.
- Quarterly webinars are conducted by the Superintendent for parents and community.
- A new volunteer Parent Advisory Committee, with representatives from each school, meets twice a year.
- An ACCESS Committee (Ascension Community Coalition for Excellent Strong Schools) meets semi-annually to gather community input on key school issues. These members are from government, business and industry, and non-profit organizations.
- A new digital flier system for parents was used to communicate school and community events, saving more than one million sheets of paper this year.
